3 die in separate incidents

One person was killed in a road accident in Narayanganj while two teenaged girls reportedly committed suicide on the outskirts of the city during the last two days.

A pedestrian was killed when a speeding truck ran over him at Tamakpatty near Sitalakkha river. Narayanganj, yesterday noon.

The victim identified as Dilip Kumar Biswas, 38, son of Subal Chandra Biswas, died on way to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

In another incident, a housewife Parvin, 18, reportedly committed suicide at her residence at Badda under Gulshan thana Wednesday night.

Parvin, wife of Jewel Khan, consumed poison following a brawl with her husband over dowry. She was rushed to the DMCH where the doctors declared her dead.

Meanwhile, 17-year-old Nazma succumbed to her burn injuries in the early hours of yesterday. Nazma of Arisptong, Tongibazar, allegedly set herself on fire to commit suicide on August 4.

The cause of the suicide could not be known immediately.

In another incident, an employee of the Petro Bangla was stabbed by a group of muggers at Banani in the city on Wednesday night.

The victim Atiar Rahman, 45, was admitted to the DMCH.

His relatives said he was going to Banani from Motijheel by an autorickshaw when the muggers intercepted the vehicle at about 10 pm. The muggers also snatched all his belongings.

NSU seminar on budget '96

Speakers at a seminar on his year's budget organised by the North South University in the city yesterday appreciated the budget document saying an excellent manifesto for next 15 years.

Dr. Salahuddin Ahmed, a professor of the Economics Department of the university, in his keynote speech said that the budget put emphasis on growth with social justice.

Dr. Ahmad expressed concern at the inflationary pressure being built within the economy because of supply disruption due to non-co-operation movement at the beginning of the year and huge monetary expenditure due to election. At this moment of extend VAT net is wrong timing as this may have inflationary impact. Because of floods already there is a supply disruption. This may lead the Bangladesh Bank to have further contractionary policy, he said.

Dr. Ahmad said that the issue of revenue mobilisation should be seen in a dynamic sense. Citing examples of other countries, he proposed that both income tax and corporate tax should be reduced and tax system should be overhauled. This would lead to productivity growth and ultimately to higher collection of taxes, he observed.

Dr. Ahmed stated that additional tax collection (about Tk. 1740 crore) could be made without VAT that isension. There are several other ways of increasing revenue such as increasing fees for government services. Dr. Ahmad proposed that price of revenue and non-judicial stamp could be increased.
