## 3 die in separate incidents

One person was killed in a  
road accident in Narayanganj  
while two teenagers girls re-  
portedly committed suicide on  
the outskirts of the city during  
the last two days.

A pedestrian was killed  
when a speeding truck ran  
over him at Tamakpottya near  
Sitalakha river, Narayanganj,  
yesterday noon.

The victim identified as  
Dilip Kumar Biswas, 38, son of  
Subal Chandra Biswas, died on  
way to the Dhaka Medical Col-  
lege Hospital (DMCH).

In another incident, a  
housewife Parvin, 18, report-  
edly committed suicide at her  
residence at Badda under Gul-  
shan thana Wednesday night.

Parvin, wife of Jewel Khan,  
consumed poison following a  
brawl with her husband over  
dowry. She was rushed to the  
DMCH where the doctors de-  
clared her dead.

Meanwhile, 17-year-old  
Nazma succumbed to her burn  
injuries in the early hours of  
yesterday. Nazma of Arisur,  
Tongibazar, allegedly set her-  
self on fire to commit suicide  
on August 4.

The cause of the suicide  
could not be known immedi-  
ately.

In another incident, an em-  
ployee of the Petro Bangla was  
stabbed by a group of muggers  
at Banani in the city on  
Wednesday night.

The victim Atiar Rahman,  
45, was admitted to the  
DMCH.

His relatives said he was  
going to Banani from Motijheel  
by an autorickshaw when the  
muggers intercepted the ve-  
hicle at about 10 pm. The  
muggers also snatched all his  
belongings.

## 1040 bottles of phenidyl recovered

## Decisions to reduce system loss, loadshedding

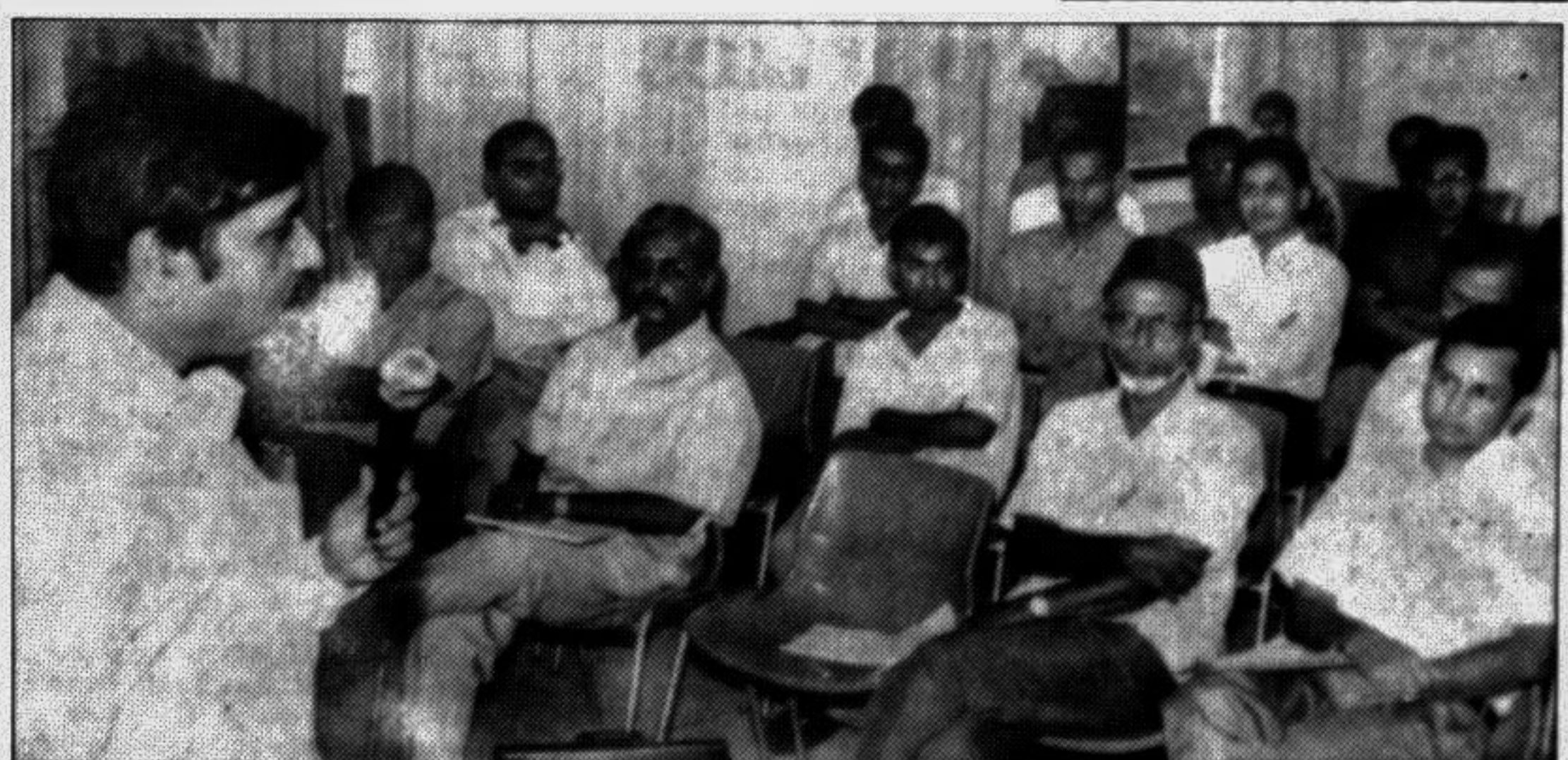
A departmental meeting of

He also stressed the impor-  
tance of exchange of medical  
scientists, including doctors,  
para-medics and technicians  
between the two countries.

Cooperation with each  
other for human resources de-  
velopment through sharing of  
experiences in medical  
science, primary health care,  
particularly in case of mother  
and child health was also em-  
phasised.

The foreign minister re-  
quested the Sri Lankan minis-  
ter to help Bangladesh firms  
to export drugs to Sri Lanka by  
helping them obtain registra-  
tion of the items of drugs.

The Sri Lankan minister  
expressed his satisfaction to be  
able to visit Bangladesh, a  
country for which he has high  
regard.

He conveyed the greetings  
of the foreign minister of Sri  
Lanka to his Bangladesh coun-  
terpart.

The Sri Lankan minister  
emphasised greater coopera-  
tion between the two countries  
in health sector, stating that  
he had very productive and  
fruitful meetings with the con-  
cerned government officials of  
Bangladesh on the subject.

Fowzie assured Azad that he  
would look into the procedural  
matters with regard to export  
of drugs from Bangladesh to

Sri Lanka and added that drugs  
could become an important  
export item to Sri Lanka.

The Sri Lankan minister  
was accompanied by his wife  
Mrs Fowzie and Deputy Direc-  
tor General of Medical Ser-  
vices of Sri Lanka Dr K M  
Velumyilum.
