


Tough-talking Tendulkar

NEW DELHI, Aug 14: Battering sensation Sachin Tendulkar settled in to his new role as India's captain today by warning teammates to shape up or ship out, reports AFP.

The 23-year-old, who replaced the beleaguered Mohammad Azharuddin as skipper earlier this week, cracked the whip on his first day in office.

"I will not allow anyone to relax," the tough-talking Tendulkar told his players during a pre-season camp in Madras ahead of the four-nation Singer Cup in Sri Lanka later this month.

"I told the players what their responsibilities are. They have to work real hard at the camp because I will not tolerate any slackness," he said.

Tendulkar's elevation to the hot seat received nationwide support after embarrassing defeats in the World Cup, two other limited-overs tournaments in Singapore and in Sharjah in the United Arab Emirates, and both the Test and one-day series in England.

But the master batsman, who served a three-year apprenticeship under Azharuddin, refuses to believe the expectations will burden his captaincy — or his extraordinary skills with the bat.

"There is no pressure," he said. "You cannot perform if you get bogged down by pressure."

"It's not that captaincy is new to me. I have led Bombay and West Zone in domestic cricket and it has not affected my batting."

"I am ready for the job. It's a

There will not be any ego hassles with Azharuddin. He is such a nice person and we get along very well.

"I will leave Azhar alone to regain his batting touch be-

cause he is such an invaluable member of the team. Easily one of the best batsmen in the world."

Azharuddin, the target of a vicious media attack because of poor form and a troubled personal life, responded by saying that Tendulkar "can be assured that I will give 100 per cent."

The selectors retained Azharuddin in the 14-man squad for the Singer Cup against world champions Sri Lanka, Australia and Zimbabwe and a five-match series against Pakistan in Canada next month.

Tendulkar said both series were tough, but ideal warm-ups for the hectic season ahead which includes home Tests against Australia and South Africa and tours to South Africa and the West Indies.

Tendulkar, whose tenure as captain is certain to be expanded beyond the Sri Lankan and Canadian tours, predicts a brighter future for Indian cricket.

"I want to make a team capable of beating any side in the world, and this team has the potential to do it," he said.

"The Singer Cup will be very interesting, but our real test will come when we play Pakistan in Canada, it's always very special against Pakistan."

The baby-faced Tendulkar, who made his international debut against Pakistan in 1989, is already a veteran of 41 Tests in which he has scored 2,911 runs with 10 centuries and 14 half-centuries.

He has also played 118 one-day internationals, scoring 4,084 runs with eight hundreds.

Reefat remains in control

Rangers won't gamble with Gascoigne

GLASGOW, Aug 14: Paul Gascoigne's chances of starring in the first match of Glenn Hoddle's term as England manager were receding on Tuesday with his Scottish club Rangers refusing to take any risks with their prize asset, reports AFP.

Graf's date with a tiro

MANHATTAN BEACH, California, Aug 14: world co-number one Steffi Graf returned from a five-week layoff to beat American Katrian Adams 6-4, 6-2 in the second round of the 450,000 dollars Acura Classic Tuesday, reports Reuters.

Graf, whose tendinitis in the left knee forced her to miss last month's Atlanta Games, didn't have the impeccable timing that has won her 100 titles, including 20 Grand Slams.

Graf had difficulty with the serve and volley style of the 94th-ranked Adams but was able to get through her first match since the Federation Cup on July 8.

"It wasn't an easy match because she doesn't give you a rhythm, so you have to play every point right from the beginning on," said the reigning

French Open and Wimbledon champion after the 68-minute match. "It was a little bit more difficult for a first round than I wanted to have."

"You try to find the lines and go for a little bit," Graf said. "But today it was impossible because we had no rallies. She serves, comes in, returns, comes in. Pretty much everything she's going to try to come to the net."

Wild 6-1, 6-2 in 55 minutes.

"I have never really seen a whole lot of her matches," Graf said of Williams. "She physically overpowers the ball. So it's just a matter of being patient with her."

Williams, who improved her career mark to 7-6, is looking forward to her first head-to-head meeting with Graf, co-ranked number one with Monica Seles.

"I think everybody always wants to play the number one player in the world," said Williams, who turned pro October 31, 1994. "I think it will be fun."

Jennifer Capriati's comeback attempt suffered another setback when she had to withdraw from her first-round match.

Capriati was scheduled to play Japan's Miho Saeki but defaulted after re-aggravating the same left gluteal strain that forced her to pull out of last week's Canadian Open in Montreal.

"I was hoping that it would be well enough for me to play this week," said the unseeded Capriati. "I had been practicing really lightly the last few days and then yesterday I went harder in the practice and I aggravated it."

Capriati added, "I'm hoping to be completely healed for the US Open."

In other second-round matches, fifth seed Amanda Coetzer of South Africa beat American Jolene Wantanabe 6-4, 6-0 and Silvia Farina of Italy upset tenth seed Nathalie Tauziat of France 6-7 (7-9), 6-3, 6-2.

In other second round action, Tommy Haas, an 18-year-old German qualifier playing his first ATP tour tournament, stunned eighth-seeded Renzo Furlan 6-1, 6-2 in the second round.

Haas, ranked 390th in the world and a finalist in the prestigious Orange Bowl junior event in Florida, beat the 30th ranked Italian with little apparent effort.

"This is a good win to beat the number 30," said Haas, who trains at the Nick Bollettieri Academy in Florida and who turned professional in March.

"But I have other dreams this week like playing Pete Sampras in the quarter-finals on Friday."

Furlan was joined on the sidelines by Britain's Wimbledon hero Tim Henman. He was beaten 6-2, 2-6, 6-4 by Mark Knowles of the Bahamas, ranked number 126 to Henman's 35.

Less than two months ago, Henman was the toast of Britain as he earned the first quarter-final berth for a home player in more than two decades at the All-England Club.

Yevgeny prevails

NEW HAVEN, Connecticut, Aug 14: French open champion Yevgeny Kafelnikov rallied from a set to beat fellow Russian Andrei Olhovskiy 6-7 (0-7), 6-3, 6-3 in the second round of the 915,000-dollar ATP Tour tournament here Tuesday, reports AFP.

Kafelnikov, the top seed, got the edge for good when he broke Olhovskiy in the second game of the third set. He saved three break points in the seventh game to take a 5-2 lead and wasn't challenged after that.

Kafelnikov, 22, has captured three titles and reached four more finals to climb to a career high ranking of fourth in the world.

In addition to his victory at Roland Garros, Kafelnikov prevailed at the Australian hard-court championship in January and the Czech Open in May. He fell to eventual champion Andre Agassi in the quarter-finals of last week's ATP championship in Mason, Ohio.

Third-seeded American Jim Courier moved into the third round with a 7-6 (7/5), 6-3 victory over Mikael Tillstrom of Sweden.

Courier, a four-time Grand Slam champion, has won just one title this year, capturing the US indoor championships at Philadelphia in March.

In first-round matches Tuesday, Shuzo Matsuoka of Japan surprised Paul Haarhuis of the Netherlands, 6-3, 6-4, 6-4 and Byron Black of Zimbabwe got past Pat Cash of Australia, 7-6 (7/5), 6-4.

Cash, a wild-card entry, was playing his second singles tournament as he attempts to come back from knee and back injuries. The 1987 Wimbledon champion also lost in the first round at Newport in July.

Becker skips Canadian Open

TORONTO, Aug 14: Boris Becker announced Tuesday he would not play in next week's Canadian Open, blaming a wrist injury he suffered at Wimbledon, reports AFP.

In recent weeks, the German star has withdrawn from tournaments in Cincinnati and New Haven.

Only one of the men's top five players — Thomas Muster — is now scheduled to play the Toronto event, usually considered a warm-up for the US Open.

Goran Ivanisevic and Wayne Ferreira are the only other two among the top ten still billed for next week.

Among the doubles, Australia's Mark Woodforde and Mark Woodbridge had already announced their withdrawal from the event.

Niyongabo's noble dedication

ROME, Aug 14: Olympic 5,000 metre champion Venus Niyongabo of Burundi, dedicating his gold medal to peace and reconciliation has condemned sanctions imposed on his war torn country by African neighbours, reports Reuters.

Burundi's Embassy in Rome on Monday released a letter from the Italian based athlete, who won his country's first Olympic gold medal in Atlanta last month, in which he thanked his compatriot for support and attacked sanctions.

Niyongabo, who currently lives in the historic central Italian town of Siena, said his experience of living abroad had taught him that change had to come from within.

"Solutions must come through internal dialogue between citizens, military intervention, economic aid or commercial sanctions imposed from outside cannot bring any lasting solutions," the athlete said in his letter.

"That is why I condemn the sanctions undertaken by certain countries neighbouring Burundi."

"Contrary to their stated objectives, these measures can only make the situation worse and will ultimately be damaging to the cause of peace and reconciliation in Burundi."

Time stood still in Tonga when ...

NUKUALOFA, Tonga, Aug 14: The Pacific Kingdom of Tonga celebrated a national holiday on Wednesday to mark the return of Olympic boxing hero Paea Wolgramm with dancing, parades and a regal banquet, reports Reuters.

Wolgramm, who fought with a broken right wrist to win Tonga's first ever Olympic medal, said shaking the hands of so many well-wishers was making the injury worse.

But he told Radio New Zealand: "As long as I don't go around punching anything for the next month or so, it should heal up."

The superweight silver medalist arrived in Tonga Tuesday night to a welcome so rapturous that it threw the international airport into chaos.

Thousands of Tongans turned out to welcome him while angry passengers cursed customs and airport staff for long queues and delays as officials celebrated with a public park.

In the evening, Wolgramm was to attend a formal reception with the King and members of Parliament.

Wolgramm, who is based in New Zealand, said he had asked for a holiday in his home island of Vava'u but would first have to face another reception and march through the town there.

Heroic welcome for Aussie Olympians

SYDNEY, Aug 14: Sydney rolled out the red carpet today as a 100,000 strong crowd lined the main city streets to welcome home the most successful Australian Olympic team ever with a ticker tape parade, reports AFP.

The winners of 41 medals — nine gold, nine silver and 23 bronze, many won by teams — filled 50-open topped cars on a slow drive from the Opera House to the Town Hall where the Olympic flag will decorate the vestibule until the Olympics here in 2000.

Balloons were released in their hundreds and green and gold smoke billowed from the top of the nearby Centrepoint Tower.

"It's the best day of my life," said swimming silver medalist Scott Miller, a favourite with the teenage girls.

The car carrying swimming superstar Kieren Perkins, who won the gold medal in the 1500 metres, eventually had to be escorted by two police on horseback, to help it through the crush.

New South Wales premier Bob Carr told the athletes before a packed crowd outside the Sydney Town Hall: "Welcome home, welcome to Sydney 2000."

ATLANTA, Aug 14: Hundreds of trees hastily planted to make Atlanta more scenic for the Olympic games are already dying from neglect and a hostile urban environment, experts said on Tuesday, reports Reuters.

Lancs-Essex NatWest finale

LONDON, Aug 14: Alec Stewart hit his second century in four days but finished on the losing side at the Oval on Tuesday as Essex pipped Surrey to a place in the final of the NatWest Trophy, reports Reuters.

In the other semifinal Lancashire survived a brave fightback led by out-of-favour England seamer Darren Gough to beat arch-rivals Yorkshire by 19 runs at Old Trafford.

Lancashire, chasing a cup double, now meet Essex in the final at Lord's on Saturday, September 7.

In Essex's four-wicket victory, Surrey captain Stewart cracked an unbeaten 125 to add to the 170 he scored for England in the second Test against Pakistan. But he was poorly supported by his teammates as Surrey reached 275 in their 60 overs.

Stewart shared in a solid opening stand of 81 with Mark Butcher from the first 26 overs. But after Butcher was run out for 27, Surrey lost their way.

It was only when all-rounder Chris Lewis came to the wicket in the run-push that the home side picked up the pace and chalked up the runs needed to make Essex sweat.

The two England men made 61 from six late overs to give the trophy favourites hope, but 275 always looked a softish target at the huge Oval ground.

Essex started with a wobble, losing England number three Nasser Hussain early on, but when Australian Stuart Law came to the crease their chase took off.

Veteran Graham Gooch (50) found his touch and Law, due

to fly to Australia straight after the match to join his side for the tour of Sri Lanka, played as if he still had bags to pack.

He cracked 53 in 44 balls to set the stage for Ronnie Irani (52 not out), who saw them home with 20 balls to spare, lifting Essex into their first NatWest final for 11 years.

At Old Trafford, Lancashire's 293-9 was built on a dazzling stand of 145 between John Crawley and Graham Lloyd. Four dropped catches also undermined Yorkshire.

Carwley, fresh from his 53 for England against Pakistan, hit 62 before being caught on the boundary off the bowling of Michael Bevan. Lloyd smashed 81 before being caught at backward point, again off Bevan.

The Australian, booked on the same flight as Law, then sparked Yorkshire's reply, cracking 85 off 106 deliveries after the visitors had lost two early wickets.

He was caught on the boundary but Yorkshire were still hopeful of revenge for their last-bat Benson and Hedges defeat by Lancashire earlier in the summer.

Gough (42) Richard Blakey (33) did their best, but with the run-rate climbing to over 10 an over, they eventually faced an impossible task and fell well short.

Yamaguchi wins fair & square

OSAKA, Japan, Aug 14: Keiji Yamaguchi pulled off a unanimous decision victory in a rematch against former champion Carlos Murillo of Panama today to retain his World Boxing Association (WBA) junior flyweight title, reports AFP.

The rematch was ordered by the WBA, following a controversy over several corrections on the judges' score sheets in the previous title bout in May when Yamaguchi won it by a narrow split decision.

Murillo, 25, became the champion in January, beating Choi Hi-Yong of South Korea. He saw his record reduced to 34 wins, including 28 KOs, against four defeats.
