Eleven cities bid for **2004 Games**

LAUSANNE, Switzerland, Aug 16: A record eleven cities have submitted bids to host the 2004 Summer Olympic Games, the International Olympic Committee said Thurs-

The bids came from Cape Town, Buenos Aires, reports

Istanbul, Lille, Rio de Janeiro, Rome, San Juan, Seville, Stockholm, Athens and St. Petersburg. The previous high was nine bids made for the 2002 winter Games which went to Salt lake City.

The bids were personally delivered by representatives of the candidate cities at the headquarters of the International Olympic Committee in Lausanne.

The deadline ends midnight Thursday but no other sunmissions were expected, a spokeswoman for the IOC said. The bids include financial plans, sites of the sports venues and proposals for

transportation and security. The IOC Evaluation Commission will now analyze the bid packages and will visit each of the sites between September and December 1996. It will make its report in February 1997 and the winner will be announced the following September.

World jr athletics meet begins Tuesday

SYDNEY, Aug 16: Almost 1,700 athletes from 138 countries will compete in the 6th IAAF World Junior Championships in athletics here next week in what the organisers said today would be a trial run for the 2000 Olympic Games, reports AFP.

The chairman of the local organising committee Phil O'Hara said the turnout, which had far exceeded expectations. would give Sydney an opportunity to "test the facilities for

the 2000 Games". "It's important to have a trial run for the Olympics," he said, particularly as international athletics events were held only infrequently in Aus-

He said the organisers would be paying particular at tention to volunteer organisation and transport facilities two elements which proved problematic at the Atlanta

The Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (SOCOG) athletics manager Bill Bailey said the junior championships would be Australia's sporting event since Brisbane hosted the Commonwealth Games in 1982.

Bailey said the junior Games had proved to be a stepping stone on the road to the Olympics for many athletes and he expected many of this year's competitors to return to Sydney in 2000.

The championship events will be held at the International Athletic Centre at what will be the Olympic site, in Sydney's western suburbs.

However, the junior athletes are being housed in seven waterside hotels in Darling Harbour, an inner-city tourist precinct, and being transported to the Olympic site by a fleet of Catamarans.

The championships, which are open to athletes under 20 years, will begin Tuesday night with an opening ceremony and the Games begin Wednesday.



ATLANTA, Aug 16: Disabled athletes from 120 countries took centre stage Thursday night at Olympic Stadium where thousands of fans still gripped by Olympic euphoria turned out for the opening ceremony of the 1996 Paralympics, reports AP.

Less than two weeks after the Olympic flame was extinguished, the crowds came back to cheer on the 3,500 disabled athletes competing in Atlanta's second round of Games.

"We're all feeling post-Olympic syndrome. This gives us a way to ease out of things a little bit," said Sue Anduze of Douglasville, Georgia, whose two teenage daughters were performing in the opening ceremony.

"Everybody went home and said. 'We're so glad the Olympics are over. Then they said What are we going to do now?" Anduze said.

Among the 64.500 spectators were Vice President Al Gore and Juan Antonio Samaranch, head of the International Olympic Committee.

"On behalf of President Clinton and a proud American nation eagerly awaiting the Paralympics to begin, I declare the 1996 Paralympic Games of Atlanta open." Gore said.

Perhaps the spectator most

in need of a post Olympic pick-me-up was Atlanta Olympics chief Billy Payne. who said the Paralympic celebration offered some relief after days spent saying goodbye to Olympic co-workers.

"It's good to come out here because the days are pretty said," Payne said. "With everybody leaving, it's tough. It's been much harder than I thought it would be.

Actor Christopher Reeve. paralysed in a horseback-riding accident in 1995, served as master of ceremonies. After a brief delay following his introduction. Reeve appeared on the stage from a rotating plat form to introduce the parade of athletes.

"As we exit this stadium consider their journeys and rejoice in their accomplishments," Reeve said. "They've arrived at a place in the world the pinnacle of competition for world-class athletes with dis-

The athletes, preceded by the flag of their home country. then slowly processed around the track, where many will be whizzing in wheelchairs and running and jumping on prosthetic limbs during the next 10 days.

Like the Paralympic events. the ceremony downplayed participants disabilities, focusing instead on their accomplishments.

Soul singer Teddy Pendergrass, who uses a motorized wheelchair since a 1982 automobile accident left him partially paralyzed, belted out "The Star Spangled Banner. Army Sgt. 1st Class Dana Bowman, who lost both legs in a skydiving accident in 1994. parachuted into a star formed by children on the field.

"Just as Dr. (Martin Luther) King taught us that the color of one's skin should not determine one's destiny, so too will these athletes teach us that one's physical characteristics should not define or limit their life's potential," said Andy Flemming, Atlanta's Paralympic chief.

Other featured headliners tapped for the ceremony included Aretha Franklin, Carly Simon, Liza Minnelli and Hall and Oates.

The stars had to compete with a crush of local volunteers, including a choir of 5,000 gospel singers that filled a stage, formed lines between delegations of athletes on the field and filled aisles in the stands.

Also on hand were 1,000 children's choir performers and hundreds of teens from school marching bands, church choirs and dance studios throughout the Atlanta area.

celebrity are so enormous that' his physical and mental resistance breaks down," Van said. "It is at these fatal moments that he falls back on drugs." Maradona, once considered

the world's greatest soccer player, flew into Switzerland on Tuesday for a drugs cure. two days after abruptly quitting his club Boca Juniors. He has twice been sus-

pended for drug abuse, in

1992 and in 1994, and has

been arrested in Argentina for cocaine possession. Maradona was originally reported to be staying at a clinic on the shores of Lake Geneva. but in fact has been living at a

hotel near Neuchatel, where he has been receiving treat-The news conference was held at a clinic in the Jura

Mountains, where Van, who is

also a professor at Berne Uni-


versity, practises. Van outlined a 10-day. three-stage course of treatment focusing on Maradona's psychological, rather than physical, need for drugs.

The first stage involves administering a drug by intravenous drip that boosts his defences. The drug was an en-

tirely natural product, said

The second stage consists of sessions with psychiatrists to reduce Maradona's "emotio-

nal overburdening. The third stage, which would not begin until next week, would directly tackle his drugs problem by trying to neutralise his obsession with

drugs consumption. Diego Maradona is not an addict in the sense that he faces withdrawal pains. The problem is more psychological than physical," Van said.

"When he needs a drug like cocaine he has to take it and then he can stop later. But he is always disappointed with himself afterwards. This is why he is determined once and for all to renounce drugs," he added.

Another psychiatrist treating Maradona. Dr Giovanni Spano, said the Argentine had been given no guarantees that he would be cured of his drug. compulsion.

"This is the first step. You can't change your life like you can change socks," said Spano.

"A full recovery will take time. Motivation is important and he wants to quit - but the possibility of a relapse is always

"I still have the programme to this day, though the scarf has now disintegrated. It has been a dream come true to sign for the club. "The atmosphere at Liver-






