Muslim rebellion ends in Philippines



It was also observed that everyone in the service of the Republic shall hold office at the pleasure of the President.

"In spite of issuance of such a Rule upon him, highest regard and respect for Chief Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed will remain ever green in the memory of the people in all the years to come as it is now and was before," the court observed.





Shehabuddin may replace Humayun as envoy to US

By Staff Correspondent K M Shehabuddin is likely to replace Humayun Kabir as Bangladesh ambassador in

Washington, according to

sources concerned. Shehabuddin, now posted in Paris as ambassador was the first member of the erstwhile Pakistan Foreign Service to take up the cause of Bangladesh in 1971. He defected on April 6 a week before the formation of the government-in-exile.

Shehabuddin played a very significant role in mobilising world opinion in favour of Bangladesh during the war of liberation.

He suggested that the government should provide soft term loans in the small and cot tage industries sector for creat ing job-opportunities as well as poverty alleviation. He also suggesting that the public sector business and industrial establishments be disinvested soon.

BNP lawmaker and former energy and mineral resources minister Khandaker Mosharrat Hossain said. "The Finance minister's budget speech that drew a bleak picture about the economic management by Khaleda Zia's government was inconsistent even with the Economic Survey of fiscal 1995-96. distributed in the House by the finance minister himself.

Quoting Survey, the former minister said that the Khaleda Zia's administration had made some "basic" contributions to the economic advancement of the country. "The BNP government had increased mobilisa tion of internal resources from one per cent in 1990-91 to 43 per See Page 12 Col 4


