CHT team plans to meet PM to talk regional problems

A high level delegation comprising the Chairmen of the Local Government Councils of three hill districts is expected to visit Dhaka soon to discuss problems and review the functions of the three local govt councils, reports UNB.

The delegation, along with the members of Parliament elected from the region, is planning to call on the Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and apprise her of the present political, financial and administrative position of three councils.

According to official sources, elections to the three hill district councils — Bandarban, Rangamati and Khagrachhari — could not be held since 1991 giving rise to financial and administrative bottlenecks and serious differences with the district administration.

The chairmen of Rangamati and Bandarban Local Government Councils (LGC) and two other members resigned from their posts and Pladaya Murang, a member of Bandarban council died three years ago. Two, other chairmen and a member resigned to contest June 12 parliamentary elections.

'Wages of jute workers won't be increased'

State Minister for Jute A K Faizul Huq told parliament yesterday that the government had no plan to increase the wages of jute workers, reports UNB.

Replying to Mashur Rahman of BNP, Huq said there are 32 jute mills operating in public sector and 76 in private sector. Four mills in the public sector and eight in the private sector remained closed.

The number of workers in the Adamjee Jute Mills is 18,971, the state minister told Mohammad Shajahan (Noakhali-4).

In reply to Mohammad Shamsul Huq (AL), he said there is no plan to reopen the Shambhuganj Jute Mills. The unit was shut down following an accord with the World Bank on jute sector reforms programme.

Film society for children formed

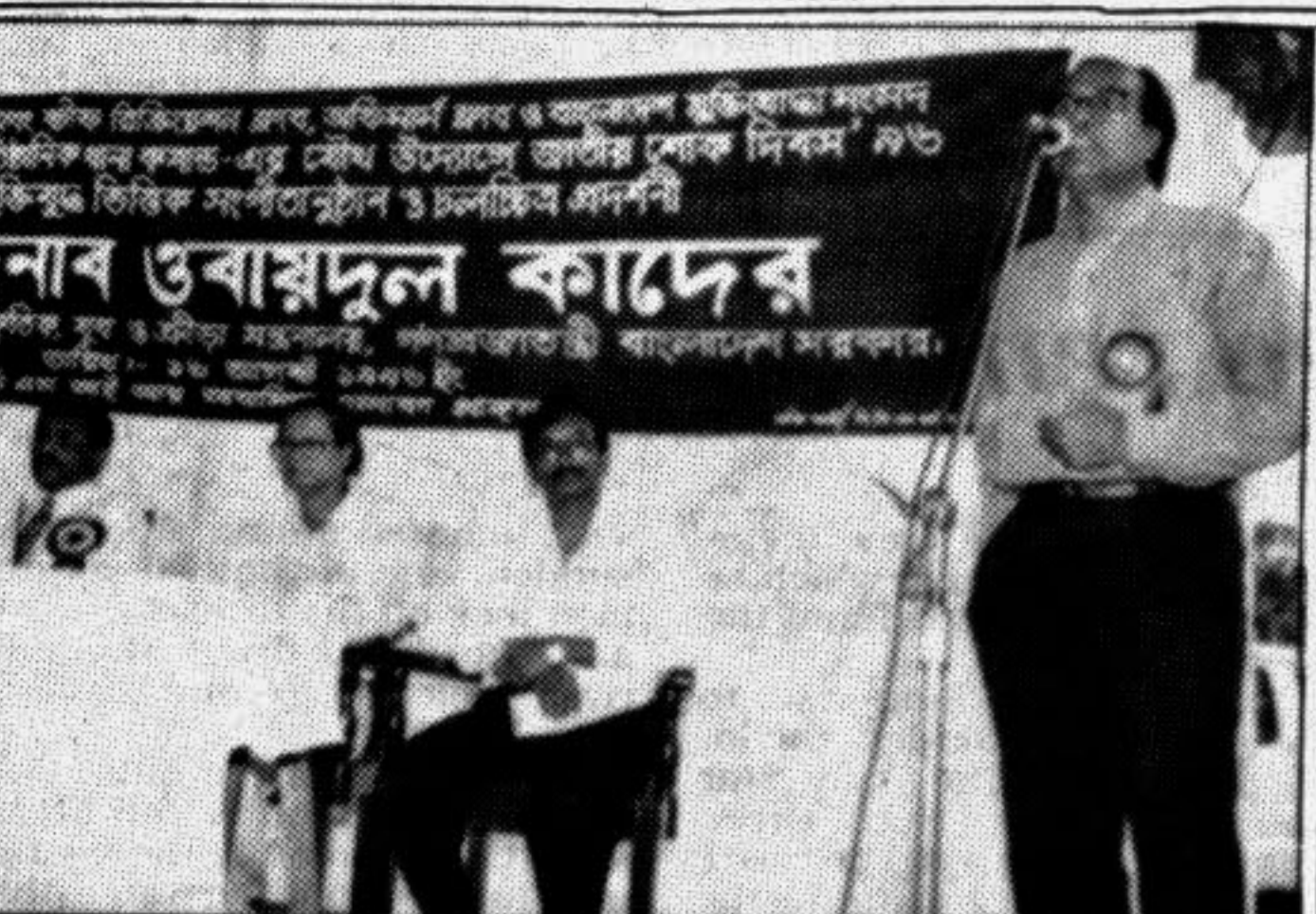
