national intranet? Unfortunately, many business leaders are putting their own interests in front of the country's, and the government lacks the necessary power (and knowledge about the Internet) to regulate things properly. You ask, "Why can't all the service providers in Bangladesh get together and connect themselves and make their own world?" And the answer is, quite simply, they are not friends. They are competitors. They don't like each other.

What I find most discouraging about all this is what may happen (I'm making a kind of McLuhan projection here) to such essential needs as education and language. Bangladesh, after all, fought its liberation war over the right to communicate in the manner and language of its choice. But the businesses I've encountered here (and I include some large NGOs which operate just like businesses) are more interested in turning the country's bright young minds into data-entry robots for English software and databanks that will ultimately serve foreign countries. It's a shame that Bangladesh, so late in this information revolution, has not yet developed a standard bangla language keyboard.

Both the local software houses and the inability of the government to take a leadership role on this issue are responsible for this egregious incompatibility that ultimately makes it difficult for Bangladeshis to communicate over computers in their own language.

But I'll end this post on a positive note: I've also noticed that a lot of Bangladeshi expatriates are very interested in providing technical assistance to "the homeland" -- whatever it requires.

within the country, Bangladesh seems divided into a million factions and interests; but from outside the country -- as the first US astronauts discovered about our earth -- Bangladesh looks like a single organism. I do think the Bangladeshi expats here in a good position to take a leadership role in forcing the country to operate as a whole, for its own interests, and not as a conglomeration of profiteering fiefdoms that, like well-trained money-hounds, follow the whims and fancies of Silicon Valley.

Yes, I agree that this is much needed in Bangladesh and want to point out that many people here in Dhaka have been lobbying for quite some time for such a network (you use the relatively recent term "intranet", but it's exactly what people here have been saying for the last four-five years -- an internal "internet", or domestic internet, or a "Bangladesh-net"). Such a network is simple and cheap -- much cheaper than linking to the Internet through VSAT to Hong Kong and Singapore, as the current Internet providers are doing (and making such ex-huberant fanfare over).

But I also want to point out that some very large local businesses and businessmen (I won't mention names) are adamantly opposed to such a project, unless they can monopolize it, or a sizable segment of it, and use it to provide data-entry or software development for even larger, more powerful foreign firms. Many people might argue that data-entry and software development are exactly what Bangladesh needs to stimulate its economy, and this may be true, but personally I don't think Bangladesh should sacrifice its ability to communicate within its borders for its ability to export data-processing and software. Such countries as South Korea, Thailand and Malaysia, which have matured around computer technology, had one thing that Bangladesh lacks -- a strong communication infrastructure, developed and operated by iron-listed leaders and firm-minded telecommunications ministries.

Can't Bangladesh have both things -- software export and a
