

9.8 million from Aman, 7.1 million tons from IRRI/Boro and the rest 1.3 million tons from wheat, according to the EPMU.

The total foodgrain requirement, estimated at the rate of 437 grams per capita per day, would stand at 20.87 million tonnes in 1996-97 while the total foodgrain available for consumption would be 19.57 million tonnes, leaving a shortfall of 1.25 million tonnes. The shortfall in foodgrain availability in 1995-96 was 1.41 million tonnes, according to the WFP.
