WB suggests expansion of VAT net

The World Bank has said continued efforts are needed to generate more revenues from Value Added Tax (VAT) and for an efficient income tax system. reports BSS.

In a report on the Annual Economic Update of Bangladesh; the Bank said the country has to earn more revenues from additional strengthening of the tax administration to raise its very low tax/GDP ratio to pave the way for further rationalisation of the import tariff

system. Notwithstanding the three percentage point gain achieved since the late 1980's, Bangladesh's budgetary revenues still amount to only 12 per cent of GDP, the bank said, adding this is much lower than the above 17 per cent in other South Asian and Asian countries and certainly well below what is needed.

13 Bangladeshis arrested in Myanmar



Implementation of a massive flood management project in north-eastern Bangladesh would depend solely on what people would say about the engineers' plans, the officials said, adding that people's suggestions would be incorporated in the project design.

The Jamalpur Priority Project (JPP), an outcome of the Tk 700-crore Flood Action Plan (FAP) studies, is one of the 31 FAP components that is going to be implemented if people from the command area give the go-ahead, they said.

The JPP (FAP 3.1), part of the FAP-3 began in August 1991 was finalised in January 1993. The 'refinement process' of the project was initiated in September, 1995 for a period of 15 months.

The proposed project is a combination of structural and non-structural measures, with plans to build embankments. improve drainage, dredge rivers and canals and undertake special projects in agriculture. fishery and environment, the officials pointed out
