The Jatiya Sangsad yester-day passed a Bill allowing private companies to establish Export Processing Zones (EPZs) to encourage export industries in the country, reports UNB.

Industries and Commerce Minister Tofael Ahmed moved the Bangladesh Private Export Processing Zone Bill, 1996 for establishing private EPZs, by foreign and local investors, to set up export industries.

The House passed the Bill by voice vote with amendments recommended by a special committee, constituted earlier to scrutinise the Bills placed in Parliament.

Opposition BNP legislator Shah Mohammad Abul Hossain proposed to send the Bill for eliciting public opinion, but the House rejected the proposal.
