CUJ demands implementation of 30pc DA

Law and order essential for economic dev: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said improvement of law and order is essential for the economic development of the country, reports UNB.

"We want to build up a self-reliant Bangladesh by restoring peace and stability," she told a huge public meeting at the zilla school ground in Bhola yesterday afternoon.

During a day-long hectic programme in Bhola district, the Prime Minister addressed the meeting defying inclement weather.

Earlier, she visited Shahabpur gas-field and erosion-affected Dania, and held more than a two-hour long divisional review meeting on law and order with high police and administrative officials.

From Shahabpur to Dania, Hasina covered some 30 kilometres in a motorcade. Eager people, including women and children, were standing at different points on the side of the road to have a glimpse of the Prime Minister.

The waiting crowds — with flags, banners, festoons and to the beat of drums — greeted the prime minister. A smiling Hasina waived her hands in response to their welcome gestures.

Addressing the meeting, immediately after a heavy downpour with most of the people standing on muddy ground, Hasina said the aim of her government is to build up a civil society, free from terrorism and exploitation.

She said the rulers of last 21 years had exploited the common people, snatched their voting rights and destroyed the spirit of the Liberation War.

The previous government had pushed the country backwards through corruption, nepotism and politicisation, she alleged and said that her government would work for building a self-reliant nation by overcoming these drawbacks.

They (BNP) have reduced the country to a nation of beggars, Hasina said adding "we want to remove the stigma by solving the economic problems of the country."

"Our commitment is economic emancipation of the downtrodden, our target: happy and prosperous Bangladesh," she said reiterating her pledge to provide medicare to all citizen and remove illiteracy within 10 years.

She went on: "We want to reach the fruits of independence to the doorsteps of every people by establishing the 'Sonar Bangla' as dream by the father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman."

Presided over by district Awami League president Mozammel Hossain Shaheen, the rally was also addressed by Commerce and Industries Minister Tofael Ahmed, Home Minister Rafiqul Islam and Food and Agriculture Minister Matiya Chowdhury.

Role of UNESCO in eradicating illiteracy lauded

DESA's Appeal to Esteemed Consumers

Because of fall in electricity generation due to temporary reduction in gas supply, electric supply in greater Dhaka area is maintained through load shedding.

In view of reducing the level of load shedding, the esteemed consumers are earnestly requested to follow the undermentioned steps.

- Keep all types of shops, shopping centres except medicine, wholesale kutchha bazar, foodshop shut from evening.
- Keep the irrigation pumps turned off during peak hours i.e. 6 pm to 10 pm.
- Refrain from all kinds of illumination except on government declared special festival days.
- Refrain from using such electrical appliances as water pump, iron, heater, cooker, water heater etc from 6 pm to 10 pm.
- Keep the single & double shift operated industries & small industrial factories shut from 6 pm to 10 pm.
- Don't burn your bulbs unnecessarily. Turn off the lights, fans & aircoolers before leaving your room.
- The choke you used for tubelight leads to wastage of 10-20 watt electricity which is counted in your meter & increases system load. Use of electronic device will minimise your bill.
- Use of electronic device for speed control of your fan will minimise the bill.
- Don't instal electric motor of capacity in excess of requirement. Minimise your electricity bill by installing appropriate capacity high efficiency motor.
- Stagger the weekly holiday of your firms on different days of the week arawise.
