Energy ministry recommendation

Power tariff to rise by 15pc within Dec

By Sharier Khan and Inam Ahmed

The Energy Ministry has recommended a 15 per cent increase in the power tariff, according to an authoritative source in the ministry.

The increase will come in two phases — ten per cent by October and another five per cent by December.

However, the power rates for irrigation and agricultural users will remain unchanged, the source said. The recommendation is

likely to be placed in the next cabinet meeting for approval. With the 15 per cent increase in the tariff, the bulk-rate of Bangladesh Power Development Board per kilowatt-hour will rise to Tk 2.15 (or about

The demands include, repolling in Laxmipur-2 and Chittagong-1 constituencies and immediate resignation of Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Md Abu Hena for his alleged failure in holding the September 5 by-election in a free and fair manner. Secretary General of BNP
