Permanent fish sanctuaries to be set up

The government will create permanent fish sanctuaries in different parts of the country for preserving rare species of fish and extensive pisciculture, reports UNB.

A meeting in preparation for setting up fish sanctuary was held in the city yesterday. State Minister for Land Rashed Mosharraf told the meeting that the government was actively considering creating fish sanctuary in the country.

State Minister for Fisheries and Livestock Satish Chandra Roy also spoke on the occasion as special guest. Fisheries and Livestock Secretary Ershadul Haq and Land Secretary Syed Marghub Murshed and high officials of both the ministries were present among others in the meeting.

The meeting decided to constitute a five-member high powered committee to study the prospects of creating fish sanctuary and cultivation of fish in the unutilised jalmahals (waterbodies), ponds, tanks and water reservoirs.

It also decided to follow the existing Fisheries Act strictly and make it more effective to refrain the people from catching immature fish.

The State Minister for Land said the government is committed to doing its best for improving lot of the fishing community in order to attain self-sufficiency in fish.

WASA accused of occupying land illegally in Demra

Hundreds of people at Maniknagar, Dhaka and Kazla of Demra thana, the city have been 'repressed and harassed' by Dhaka WASA for long, reports UNB.

Some social leaders of the three areas made the allegation at a press conference at Jatiya Press Club yesterday.

Reading out a statement, Kazimuddin Sarder alleged that Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority had illegally occupied 52 acres of land for its Ramna Sewerage Treatment Plant.

For the last 21 years, court has time and again rejected WASA's statement that it had acquired the land for the plant, he said, but the WASA continued its occupation on the land with the help of Ansars and some local mastans.

"It is flagrant violation of law," Kazimuddin Sarder said and urged the newly elected Awami League government to actively consider the matter for public good.

He told the newsmen that some dishonest officials of the WASA with the help of mastans had been cultivating fish in half the area of the 52 acres of land. The remained 50 per cent land has been filled with earth.

Kazimuddin Sarder said the WASA for Ramna Sewerage Treatment Plant had long ago acquired land at Sayedabad. "But WASA's corrupt officials have kept the acquired land under their possession and it continued repression on 'illegally,' he told the journalists.

The press conference was attended, among others, by Abul Hashem, Abdul Aleem, Ahmadi Ali and Kamaruddin.

Ctg mayor calls for united efforts to curb terrorism

CHITTAGONG Sept 22: Mayor of Chittagong ABM Mohtuiddin Chowdhury has called upon the people to help root out terrorism to ensure peace and order in society, reports BSS.

He was speaking as chief guest at the installation ceremony of Paharali Merchants Association (PMA) here yesterday.

Mohiuddin said, terrorists and miscreants are small in number and they can be rooted out when people unitedly resist them. He alleged that a vicious circle was out to create trouble in order to tarnish the image of the government. It is the responsibility of the people to identify the troublemakers and hand them over to police, he added.

He also called upon the members of the law enforcing agencies to sternly deal with terrorists and criminals.

Haji Aminul Haq, a leader of the PMA, presided over the function.

BSEHR expresses concern at 'misuse of law'

The secretary general of Bangladesh Society for the Enforcement of Human Rights (BSEHR) has expressed grave concern at the 'continuous misuse and abuse of law' by the law enforcing agencies in the country, reports UNB.

In a statement yesterday, BSEHR Secretary General Siguna Huda urged the government not to tarnish its reputation by inflicting degrading torture to anybody in the name of remand.

"The nation expects that the trial of the killers of the nation's leaders be conducted in a free, fair and equitable manner as is provided in law," she said. Deploing the killing of all sorts, political or otherwise, she stressed the need for justice and looking for the culprits through the due process of law.

"Yet the inhumane treatment in the name of remand, and that too a continuous remand in order to obtain 'voluntary' confession under section 164 CrPc is deplorable," the BSEHR executive said.

She urged the magistrate to believe and practice that "an accused is innocent till proven guilty beyond reasonable doubt."

"Long term remands are violative of all norms of decent behaviours, laws and concept of human rights as contained in the various international instruments of human rights and finally ultra constitutional," Siguna Huda added.

IUB prof elected president of SAREIA

Professor Haroun-ur-Rashid, Director, School of Environmental Science and Management of Independent University of Bangladesh (IUB) was elected president of the South Asia Regional Environmental Impact Association (SAREIA) at a four-day workshop held recently in Kathmandu, reports UNB.

The workshop, on participatory strategic planning for strengthening the capability of Environmental Impact Association (EIA) in South Asia region, was organised by the Regional Environmental Assessment Centre of IUCN based in Kathmandu.

Dr Ram Khadka of the Environmental Assessment Centre of IUCN in South Asia was elected Secretary-Treasurer. At the end of the workshop the participants issued the Kathmandu Declaration on strengthening EIA capacity in South Asia, said an IUB press release yesterday.

Amin has left behind one son, six daughters, a number of grandchildren and relatives to mourn her death. She was buried at the Azimpur Old Graveyard yesterday afternoon. Earlier, her namaz-e-janaza was held at Elephant Road Aeroplane Mosque. Her kulkhwani will be held tomorrow after Asr prayers at her 351 Elephant Road residence.
