

Bierhoff's rebuttal

UDINESE, Italy, Sept 23: Germany's Euro '96 hero Olivier Bierhoff dispelled rumours on Thursday that he would be joining English Premiership strugglers Blackburn from his Serie A club Udinese, saying he would honour his contract, reports AFP.

Blackburn, the 1994 Premiership champions, had targeted 28-year-old Bierhoff as the man to fill the void left by Alan Shearer who left for Newcastle in the summer for a world record 15 million pounds (about 23 million dollars).

It had been thought that Blackburn officials were in Italy on Wednesday in negotiation with the player and officials from Udinese.

However, Bierhoff, scorer of Germany's two goals in their Euro '96 triumph over the Czech Republic, denied any knowledge of meeting them.

"This story has been featured in the German press over the last few days but I know nothing about it. Besides I have a contract with Udinese and I intend to honour it," Bierhoff said.

It was understood that Blackburn were offering five million pounds (7.5 million dollars) for Bierhoff.

Carlo Piazzolla, managing director of Udinese, denied there had been any contact between the clubs.

"We don't know anything about these rumours. As far as I am concerned we haven't received one phone call about Olivier," Piazzolla said.

Bierhoff has played for Bayer Urdingen, Hamburg and Borussia Monchengladbach and Austrian club Casino Salzburg.

He later moved into Italian football with Ascoli before joining Udinese two seasons ago.

MSC stay on course

Mohammedan Sporting Club crossed a major hurdle in their chase for regaining the title with a comprehensive 2-0 win over Muktijoddha Sangsad Kira Chakra in a Danish Premier football league match at the flood-lit Dhaka Stadium yesterday.

With a packed audience in attendance at the big bowl, mercurial midfielder Arman Miah cracked the evening's duck with a spectacular curler to enable the black and whites a 12th minute lead. Later, striker Alfaz confirmed Mohammedans sixth win in the league with a low drive seven minutes from the final whistle.

For Muktijoddha, dubbed as the third force behind the two perennial foes in the domestic circuit — Mohammedan and defending champions Abahani — yesterday's defeat served a severe blow in their chase for a maiden league title.

On the other hand, Mohammedans, recovering from their debacle against Fakirerpool YMC when they were jolted by a one-all draw after five successive wins, the deserving victory consolidated their position atop the table with 19 points from seven outings.

In the day's match Mohammedans, who appeared with a better game plan, kept the all-red at bay in a lively encounter marked by sorties at both ends.

The traditional superpower took the lead from their first positive attack down the right flank.

Shabbir, who made a magnificent return this year after wandering in the wilderness during the last couple of seasons due to injury, set up Arman with

a defence-splitting through ball. The wispy mid fielder found the opponents net with a scorching right-footer from the righthand corner of the box (1-0).

Arman then set the stage for double delight of the strong band of black and white supporters in the 23rd minute with a gem of a through ball. Alfaz, despite having Muktijoddhas custodian Pannu at his mercy drove the priceless breakable wide off the mark much to the horror of his teammates.

It was a tall order for Muktijoddha, who not only lost four of their key booters in this year's limited players' transfer, but also missed the service of their central defender Kingshuk who was on a two-match ban to have a go against a well-groomed and spirited Mohammedans. Nevertheless, the handicapped Mukhtis had their share of openings. In the 36th minute, their diminutive midfielder Zakir, undoubtedly the

best performer of the night, almost broke the Mohammedan defence before being brought down by Nurul Huq Manik on the edge of the box.

Tito lobbed a near-perfect shot from the free-kick which narrowly missed the mark after a deflection from the Mohammedans wall.

After the breather Muktijoddha, desperately in search of an equaliser, stormed the opponents' citadel with waves of attack. But they were frustrated time and again by their dark and dapper winger Golam Gaus, who failed to float a single lob from the right, leaving a dejected striker Naqub hovering in the 'D' but to no avail.

Ten minutes into the second half Muktijoddha earned two successive flag kicks. But an ambitious Gaus disappointed

his side on both occasions shooting straight to a shaky Mohammedan custodian Ponir. Although Ponir was a nervous man under the bar, among the two national keepers, Pannu stood tall at the other end despite conceding two superlative goals.

The reserve national custodian made a brilliant reflex save in the 67th minute off a lqbal point blank shot from about seven yards and then stretched full to his left to fist away a Shabbir free kick 11 minutes later.

But when Alfaz hammered a pile-driver after being fed by Manik, who won a ball from a defence lapse, Pannu had little to offer to avoid an imminent defeat. It was Alfaz's fourth goal in the league (2-0).

Raz, the culprit of that late fumble, however, tried to amend his previous blunder with a thunderous shot at the stroke of the final whistle. But his right footer rebounded off the cross-piece with Ponir beaten far and square.

With his defeat Muktijoddha who were closely following the table leaders along with Abahani, both having been collected 14 points from six matches, slid further behind in the title race on completion of the seven league engagements.

Weah bails Milan out

MILAN, Sept 23: George Weah hauled AC Milan out of their crisis on Sunday when the Liberian scored the match winner in a morale boosting 2-1 victory at Bologna.

Parma are top of the Serie A on goal difference after beating Reggiana 3-2 on Saturday night, but they are joined on seven points by European Champions Juventus and Inter Milan.

However, Sunday's spotlight was on Bologna, and an AC Milan team whose confidence, has been badly rattled by successive defeats to FC Porto in Champions League and Sampdoria in the Serie A.

After a goalless first half, Marco Simone looked to have banished Milan's worries with a superb volley just three minutes after the re-start.

The Euphoria lasted just five minutes before Russian Igor Kolyonov rattled in a penalty for Bologna after French mid fielder Marcel Desailly had felled Swedish striker Kennet Anderson.

But Weah, surrounded by the Bologna defence, stabbed the ball home four minutes later and Milan held on for the win, despite Dutch substitute Edgar Davids being sent off three minutes after the whistle for arguing.

The match was watched by Italian national coach Arrigo Sacchi, as he prepares to choose his squad for next month's World Cup qualifiers against Moldova and Georgia.

Juventus meanwhile needed two goals in the last 10 minutes to earn a 2-1 win at newly promoted Perugia.

Both sides finished with 10 men — Salvatore Matreano being dismissed in the 56th minute for Perugia and Juventus substitute Michele Padovano broke the deadlock

with some clinical finishing after a 30-yard gallop through Perugia's off side trap.

Alessandro del Piero then coolly netted the second in another one-on-one with Perugia keeper Alexander Kocic, while Marco Negri got a consolation goal for Perugia just before the whistle.

Conselmo Robbati needed only six minutes to open the scoring for Fiorentina at home to Verona. curling in a fine left footed shot from outside the box.

Florentina skipper Gabriel Batistuta sealed a 2-0 victory, knocking home a penalty after Verona goalkeeper Attilio Gregori had hauled down striker Oliveira.

Oliver Bierhoff, who was lined with a move to Blackburn Rovers in the English Premiership this week, earned Udinese a 2-1 victory over Cagliari.

Bierhoff, who scored twice as a substitute in the final to win the European Championship for Germany, slammed in the rebound after his header had bounced back off the crossbar in the 23rd minute.

Uruguayan Fabian O'Neill was hero and villain for Cagliari, notching a 19th minute equaliser and then being set off in the 55th.

In Sunday's other action, Vicenza crushed Atalanta 4-1 but Napoli were held to a 1-1 draw at home by Piacenza.

Great news for Gunners

LONDON, Sept 23: Arsenal will be boosted by the long-awaited arrival of new manager Arsene Wenger and the return of inspirational captain Tony Adams when they bid to keep their European hopes alive on Tuesday, reports AFP.

Frenchman Wenger, who flew into London from Japan on Sunday, will be thrown in at the tactical deep end when the Gunners seek to overturn a 3-2 first leg deficit against Germany's Borussia Monchengladbach in the UEFA Cup.

Caretaker manager Pat Rice said Wenger's arrival five weeks after the shock sacking of Bruce Rioch, signals the dawning of a new era for the north London Club.

He added: "My understanding is that the new manager will take charge on Wednesday and the return to Japan. Grampus Eight have an important game on Saturday and he wants to say goodbye to the players."

Meanwhile England captain Adams, who confessed to alcoholism last week, played for an hour in Saturday's 2-0 win at Middlesbrough without any ill-effects on the knee injury that had kept him out all season.

And caretaker manager Rice saluted the way Adams has handled his battle against the

bottle.

"Tony doesn't run away from his problems," said Rice. "He's an inspirational player for Arsenal. He typifies every thing that is good about the club. He has a never say die attitude, a willingness to drive himself on, and is an inspiration to everyone around him."

Muster pays thru' the nose

VIENNA, Sept 23: Austrian tennis star Thomas Muster on Sunday called for action to be taken against Brazil in the wake of his disqualification in a Davis Cup tie where he claims he was insulted and spat on by the crowd, reports AFP.

And Christian Ransmayr, vice-president of the Austrian Tennis Federation, criticised the crowd by saying, "If someone says 'I'll kill you' we interpret that as a criminal act."

However, Ransmayr did not rule out a ban for Muster for his reaction.

The former world number two Muster was disqualified on Saturday after angrily walking off court while he and Udo Plamberger were playing Gustavo Kuerten and Jaime Oncins.

Muster, the 1995 French Open champion, was clearly upset by the jeers and abuse of the partisan home crowd, and he picked up a warning for making an obscene gesture to spectators in the fourth set.

The Austrians, level-pegging at 1-1 in the tie after Friday's singles, were always trailing Kureten and Oncins in a tense encounter. Muster, clearly furious with the behaviour and attitude of the South American crowd, stalked off court with the visitors trailing 0-2 in the fifth set.

The match was immediately awarded to the Brazilians at 7-6 (7-2), 4-6, 6-3, 3-6, 2-0.

Muster, who said he will never again play in Brazil, argued the behaviour of the crowd was unacceptable. "During three and a half hours we were insulted, spat upon and objects were thrown at us," said Muster, before adding action should be taken against Brazil.

"It's a security matter. If this is Davis Cup, then I want nothing to do with the competition."

If I'm punished, it's all the same to me. It was so bad you could call it a war."

However, Muster believed he was not being over-sensitive. "Did I really have to wait till I was shot in the head before someone did something?"

Austrian coach Ronald Leitzger backed up Muster's stance.

"We tried to stay calm, but the behaviour towards us and to Thomas was unacceptable," he said, adding the umpires did not have the situation in hand.

"If Thomas feared for his personal safety, there were reasons," Leitzger also asked for action to be taken against Brazil.

The International Tennis Federation has called for reports from the referee, its observer Thomas Hallberg, and both national associations. The matter will be considered by the Davis Cup committee at their meeting in London on October 7.
