goal in last season's two Champions' League fixtures between the two sides, struck in a swift counter-attack only seven minutes into the game.

Playmaker Andreas Moeller launched a long ball for the young German striker who ran into the box before netting with a shot just inside Romanian keeper Daniel Gherasim's righthand post.

Borussia went further ahead in the 37th minute when Gherasim parried a Borussia shot which rebounded off German midfielder Joerge Heinrich into the net

An inexperienced Steaua team, crushed 4-0 by Atletico Madrid two weeks ago, were only in the match early on but squandered two scoring chances.

Chapuisat scored Borussia's third goal one minute after coming on as substitute for Ricken.

Steaua midfielder Damian Militaru missing a great chance near the end of the match when he rattled the bar with a shot from just four metres out.



Warne opted out of next month's Indian tour, which includes a one-off Test and a triangular one-day series also featuring South Africa, after the slow recovery of his spinning linger from a recent surgery.

Madan Lal said his players would not have spent sleepless nights worrying about Warne. "Our players are very good at

handling spin bowling and even though Warne's a world-class bowler, he may not have been a very big threat, he said.

Britain's quest for booster

LONDON, Sept 26: Britain may pay gold medalists 20,000 pounds (32,000 dollars) at the 2000 Sydney Olympics as part of a 12-point plant to improve the nation's standing at the world biggest sporting extrava ganza, reports Reuter.

In the country's worst Olympic performance since the 1952 Helsinki Games, rowers Steve Redgrave and Matthew Pinsent won Britain's only title in Atlanta this year.

A report from British chef de mission Richard Palmer, presented to the British Olympic Association's annual general meeting on Wednesday, acknowledged that Atlanta had been "something of accurate's egg - good and bad in places. "Atlanta, despite its many

positive features, was a hard difficult Games." Palmer said "Clear messages have been signalled, both to the Olympic movement and to British sport. "British sport need wit,

unagination and clear focus if it is to meet the challenges that are certain to face us in Sydney in 2000.

"There is more money the runs being scored in Indian cricket.

Dungarpur also waned that there would be no room for unfit

players under the new regime. The gruelling schedules of modern cricket demand peak fitness. I am not convinced the younger players take physical training as seriously as they should," he said.

Dungarpur's outburst follows a disappointing run over the past year, in which India failed to win five limited over tournaments, including the World Cup, and lost both the

Test and one-day series in Eng 26: India's new land.

Dungarpur showed he meant business by sacking national coach Sandeep Patil soon after assuming office. "It's a result oriented world," he said. Patil, 42, was sacked because

of India's poor performance since he took over as manger from Ajit Wadekar after the World Cup earlier this year. Under Patil, India failed to

win three limited-over tournaments in Singapore, Sharjah and Colombo, lost both the Test and one-day series in England. and were beaten 2-3 by arch-rivals Pakistan in Canada last week. Patil was replaced by Madan Lal

The 45-year-old Madan Lal. whose term runs till next May. was, like Patil, a member of the World Cup winning Indian team in 1983.

He played 39 Tests since his debut in England in 1974, scoring 1,042 runs and taking 71 wickets.

The shake-up, however, leaves India short of experience at the top when they begin a busy season next month, which includes Test matches and oneday against Australia, South

Africa and the West Indies. The one-off Test match against Australia in New Delhi from October 10 Sachin Tendulkar's first as captain, will also be Madan Lal's debt as coach and former pace bowler

Ramakant Desai's first as chief selector.

Desai and off spinner Shivalal Yadav replaced Gundappa Vishawanath and Anshuman Gaekwad in the five-man selection committee, with also includes non-Test players Sambaram Banerjee. Kishen Rungta

and Mohinder Pandove. Dungarpur brushed aside criticism that a selection committee short of Test experience - Desai played 28 Tests and Yaday 35 - was not suited for the

"Australian never won the Ashes when Sir Donald Bradman was chief selector," said Dungarpur, himself a non-Test player who served as selector for six years.
