"During our 100 days we have succeeded in materialising some of our pledges. We have also taken steps to implement some other commitments," she added.

The Prime Minister said her party had adopted a very "stern attitude against terrorists and already taken actions against some police officials for showing leniency towards certain terrorists who had used the name of the ruling party as their cover." She said the terrorists have no political identity and "my government will not show any mercy towards them."

Sheikh Hasina reiterated her appeal to the misguided youths and students to return to normal life for which the government would extend cooperation for their rehabilitation.

The prime minister said neutrality in the administration has been ensured by bringing discipline in the appointment and promotion of civil and military officials by disregarding political pressure and likings and dislikings.

Speaking about the different administrative measures, the Prime Minister said the government formulated the Rules of Business anew, making ministers the executive heads of ministries keeping pace with the tradition of parliamentary

democracy. Sheikh Hasina referred to the pay commission and said it had been formed and it would present its recommendations in

the next six months. She said a total of 19 bills were passed in the first session of the Jatiyasangsad. She said a parliamentary task force was formed with both treasury and opposition members to strengthen the parliament activities to make the Jatiya Sangsad the centre of all activi-

The present government, Sheikh Hasina said, has also taken decision on not issuing any permit for consumer goods like sugar, fertiliser, paper, keeping pace with the open market policy, "the past gov-ernment had hampered the smooth distribution of such consumer goods through permitism," she said.

She said instead of ministers, the government has decided to make MPs as head of

parliamentary standing com- the deliberations on purchase mittees to strengthen accountability and transparency of the government.

Referring to the presentation of budget within a short span of time, the Prime Minister said prices of essential commodities have remained more or less stable in the post-budget period, which is a big success of the government

Sheikh Hasina said the prospects of foreign investment had brightened following the installation of the present government. She said because of the confidence of the international community in the present government. "We have received pledges for maximum amount of foreign assistance this time. The present noticeable buoyancy in the stock exchange reflects of the confidence reposed on this government by the investors.

The Prime Minister said it was the people who should take credit for whatever the government has achieved in the last 100 days, getting opportunity to serve them after 21 years. "We want to build Bangladesh free from poverty, and therefore we want the country to get rid of the curse of illiteracy and to ensure the basic needs of food, cloths and shelter and job opportunity to everyone," she

Said. Our Staff Correspondent adds: During the question-answer session, the Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said that those responsible for the killing of Late president Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and members

of his family should be tried. There is no scope for murderers to get cover under a black law like 'Indemnity Ordinance', she told a questioner. She, however, parried a question whether she was planning to repeal the ordinance.

The Prime Minister also said that those responsible for the deaths of farmers during agitations for fertiliser last year as well as those responsi-ble for the fertilizer crisis would also face trial.

She answered a host of questions ranging from issues like sharing of Ganges water to power shortage and off-loading of shares of state-owned enterprises as well as politics involving religion.

"We shall certainly get our due share of the Ganges. We are trying to get it before the next dry season," she said on the progress of the talks on sharing of water with India.
