Normalcy in the region yet to return

The mistrust which develuation turned tense following oped following the disappearence of Kalpana Chakma and a few follow up incidents Kalpana Chakma in last June based on it has intensified after the brutal killing of 33 woodcutters in Churakhali of Baghaichhari thana between tribals and non-tribals segrekilling of 33 woodcutters by the tribal insurgents at Churakhali gated them socially, economically and psychologically, in Baghaichhari thana of the Shah Alam observed. Shah Alam was, however, found optimistic returning back the acutely felt normalcy by restoring trust and mutual understanding between tribals and non-tribals through motivating them and holding meetings and personal contacts.

A meeting in the continuous process in returning back nor-malcy and amity was held the first day of this month in the conference room of the DC with Shaha Alam in the chair. UP chairman of Baghaichhari, Azizur Rahman Aziz, Balukhali




