Earlier, Muyeed Chowdhury informed the Prime Minister that the overall actual physical progress of the project was 55 per cent against a planned target of 69 per cent. Considering the size and complexities of the project, the progress achieved is satisfactory, he said. However, he added that steps were being taken to expedite the work in order to complete the project. Chowdhury told the Prime

Minister that the bridge would ultimately be capable of carry ing a dual carriage road with provision for traffic and breakdown lane in each direction, a single tract metre gauge railtrack, a 230-ky electrical power line, a high pressure natural gas pipeline, and telecommunication cables.

Chowdhury said that the bridge, one of the biggest in the world, would have a life span of 100 years. Possible cyclone and storms during this period are taken into consideration as well as anti-earthquake devices will be used so that the bridge can withstand any such natural calamities or disasters.

Besides, under the massive river training work, necessary protective work has been undertaken at Bhuapur hard-point, on the eastern bank of Jamuna, upstream of the bridge, to maintain a 'strong point', on the bank, he added.

The Prime Minister was also apprised of other aspects of the project including construction of approach roads on both east and west banks, action plans on environment management and resettlements.

Elaborating on the plans, Chowdhury informed the Prime Minister that under the resettlement plan, the affected people of the project area would be provided transfer grant, house construction aids, grant to cover 50 per cent premium and one-time cash grant for share
