Tendulkar upbeat

HYDERABAD, Oct 15: Indian skipper Sachin Tendulkar today expressed confidence of winning the inaugural match of the T20 triangular cricket series against South Africa to be held here on October 17, reports PTL.

Tendulkar, who arrived with the Indian squad this morning, looked positive after the thumping seven-wicket victory against Australia in the one-off cricket Test in Delhi, and said "We have come here to win."

To a query on whether Mongolia would open the innings, the young skipper said "I don't think so" but did not divulge any further details.

A trial by TV camera!

GLASGOW, Oct 15: The all-seeing eye of the television camera cost Falkirk captain Albert Craig a further two-match suspension in Scottish football's first trial-by-television case, reports Reuters.

Craig had been called in front of the disciplinary committee of the Scottish Football Association following an incident involving Partick Thistle's Gareth Evans when the clubs met in August.

Both had been sent off but Craig reached after Evans and a further incident, captured by the TV cameras but not witnessed by any of the match officials, took place in the tunnel leading to the dressing rooms.

Craig was automatically suspended for two games for two red cards and Evans for one game for one red card.

But the SFA imposed an extra two-game ban after watching video pictures of the incident and Craig will now miss the league matches against St Johnstone and Partick Thistle.

He said later: "I had a fair hearing." In another case, Celtic manager Tommy Burns was fined 3,000 pounds (4,700 dollars) by the SFA for adopting an aggressive attitude towards referee Stuart Douglas after Celtic's 1-1 draw with Kilmarnock last April.

Kiwis call in Young

WILLINGTON, Oct 15: Veteran opening batsman Bryan Young was Tuesday confirmed to replace injured Blair Pocock on the New Zealand cricket team to visit Sharjah and Pakistan from next month, reports AP.

Young had been on standby for fellow opener Pocock since the squad was named on Sept. 22 and was added to the squad when it became clear Pocock would not recover in time from surgery on his right shoulder.

Young, 31, is starting his 14th first-class season and has played in 18 Tests, scoring 1025 runs at 30.05, and 47 one-day internationals.

Pocock is the second player to withdraw from the tour. Medium-pace Chris Pringle pulled out last week with an ankle injury and was replaced by all rounder Justin Vaughan.

Fast bowler Danny Morrison, who is recovering from a groin operation, will undergo two fitness Tests later this week.

SOCCER SIDELINES

LONDON, Oct 15 (Agencies): Aston Villa goalkeeper Mark Bosnich was charged with misconduct by the English FA on Monday following his Nazi salute to Tottenham supporters during Saturday's Premier league game.

The Australian could also face criminal charges as police continued investigations in to the second-half incident which incensed Tottenham fans, many of whom are Jewish.

An FA spokesman said: "Mark Bosnich has been charged with misconduct following a widely publicised incident during last Saturday's match with Tottenham. An FA disciplinary commission will consider the case in the near future."

"The FA have also had several contacts today with policy and we understand their investigation into an alleged public order offence will continue. When it is completed, a report will be sent to the crown prosecution service."

Bosnich has publicly apologised for his gesture, made after fans had baited him over an incident 18 months ago when he knocked Tottenham's striker at the time, German Juergen Klinsmann, unconscious in a rash challenge.

In another case, Arsenal striker Ian Wright was charged with the same Football Association over alleged remarks made about Sheffield Wednesday manager David Pleat.

Wright was reported in some newspapers to have called Pleat a "pervert" in the aftermath of the Arsenal-Sheffield Wednesday game at Highbury on September 16 which the Gunners won 4-1.

He has been ordered to attend an FA disciplinary commission on a date to be arranged.

BANKING ON BALLOT

The Professional Footballers' Association (PFA) said Monday they will announce the result of their ballot on possible strike action by players in English Divisions One, Two and Three at the weekend.

Ballot forms have to be in by Wednesday and if the vote is in favour of a mass walk-out, chairmen of league clubs will be given seven days notice.

The strike, which would be the first of its kind in the game, would then come into effect by November 1.

The PFA's dispute is with the football league over what they consider is a fair share of the TV money.

BOSSSES IN A STEW

Middlesbrough manager Bryan Robson and Southampton boss Graeme Souness were hit by fines on Monday after being found guilty of misconduct by the Football Association (FA).

It follows the FA's endorsement of a plea by Premier league referees for managers to observe a 30-minute "cooling off" period before confronting match officials at the end of matches.

Robson was fined 1,500 pounds (about 2,250 dollars), severely censured and warned to his future conduct over remarks made to referee Michael Riley after the match with Nottingham Forest on August 24.

Souness has been fined 750 pounds and warned about his future conduct as the result of remarks made to Riley after the match at Leicester on August 21.

Aussies begin well

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 15: Top seeds Australia took the first step towards retaining their women's tennis title in Kuala Lumpur on Monday with a 3-0 pool victory over fifth seeds Germany, reports AFP.

Michelle Martin, surprisingly beaten by teammate Liz Irving in the World Open quarter finals last Friday had a fragile start against Germany's Sabine Schoene, winning the first 9-5 before settling 9-1, 9-1.

The German wanted too many points to be any threat although Martin looked vulnerable initially.

Second string Liz Irving, stumbled and twisted an ankle to the consternation of the Australian bench but recovered after dropping the second to 4-9 to win 10-8, 9-5.

With Carol Owens having won convincingly at third string that gave Australia a 3-0 win.

England, second seeds and title holders from 1985 to 1990, were dominant against Egypt with only new cap Linda Charman dropping a game.

England however had suffered their first upset before the event with the last minute withdrawal of Sue Wright. She suffered a back injury and was replaced by Fiona Geaves.

Third seeds New Zealand defeated sixth seeds Netherlands 3-0 although the world number 14 Lellani Marsh struggled to establish consistent control against the Dutch third string Nicole Beumer.

Denmark, who are attempting to move up from eighteenth position, were 1-1 with Italy before Julie Dom-Jensen beat Sonia Pasteris of Italy 9-0, 9-5, 9-1 to give the Danes a 2-1 win.

The South Korean will spend the majority of his time working in court with the country's Olympic players under the direction of Steve Baddeley, the badminton Association of England's director of elite play.

Baddeley said on Monday: "To secure the services of the world's greatest doubles player will be of undoubted benefit to our top players. His level of expertise and experience and insight into winning major competitions is unique and could make the difference between a fourth place and a gold medal in Sydney."

Inter to stand by Ince

MILAN, Oct 15: Inter Milan are to appeal against a suspension for Paul Ince after the England midfielder was sent off at the weekend after being subjected to racist abuse, reports AFP.

The trouble started on Saturday night when Piacenza defender Gianpietro Piovani went over to Ince and shouted racial abuse at the Englishman as they waited for a corner kick.

Ince responded by touching Piovani lightly on the shoulder and his opponent, who has since admitted faking injury, dropped to the ground. Ince was immediately given his marching orders.

Under league rules, a judicial panel will meet on Wednesday to apply the relevant sanctions - a one or two-day ban. Clubs are then free to appeal that verdict before the disciplinary committee on Friday.

An Inter spokesman told the news agency on Monday: "Our lawyers are now preparing an appeal to the disciplinary committee, which will meet at the end of the week."

Club president Massimo Moratti hopes Ince's case will not even get that far.

"I'm sorry about his sending-off," he told the Gazzetta dello Sport. "I hope that he will be cleared by sporting judiciary. I hope there will be an amnesty for an offense which was never committed."

Ajax's days as also-rans

AMSTERDAM, Oct 15 (Reuters): An exuberant blend of talent, youth and intelligence, promised to usher in "an orange future" but Ajax Amsterdam, who strutted the European stage for two glorious seasons, have lost their shine.

The 1995 World and European champions, dethroned by Juventus last season only in a penalty shoot-out, have spluttered and wheezed and already look out of the reckoning for major titles.

Ripped apart by the Bosman ruling on freedom of movement for out-of-contract players and uncomfortable in a 21st century palace of a stadium, the Dutch champions are in danger of slipping back among Europe's commoners.

The club's philosophy remains undimmed but injuries and transfer have taken their toll, while some mutter darkly about the move to a towering multi-million guilder stadium.

The impressive arena, built to house the cream of European soccer, is currently playing host to mid-table mediocrity.

The pitch is worn and hampers Ajax's fluid style, while fans lament the absence of history and air of invincibility which the club had in their old cramped headquarters at De Meer.

After a miserable pre-season Ajax have failed to fire in the domestic campaign. The games into the championship, they are sixth in the First Division. Sandwiched between Roda JC Kerkrade and Vitesse Arnhem with just 16 points.

A 1-0 away win at Auxerre in the European Cup Champions League opener raised hopes that Ajax's dismal early league form was misleading.

But defeat at home to Grasshopper Zurich in the second encounter means they have no guarantee of a place in the last eight of Europe's premier club competition.

More pertinently, Ajax have scored only 10 league goals. And that, observers say, is the crux of their malaise.

The Ajax machine continues to create chances, though not quite as fluently as in the past two seasons, but it has lost the killer touch in front of goal.

Patrick Kluitert is sidelined with a knee ligament injury which will keep him out until November. Nigerian fellow striker Nwankwo Kanu, whose career is now threatened by a
