## PM tells physicians Directive given to upgrade medical college hospitals to 500 beds

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said her government wants to reach medical services to the doorsteps of the people by adopting proper policy and planning, reports BSS.

"We don't want to do anything in a haphazard way for which people will suffer," she said in an oblique reference to the last five years of mismanagement and anomalies of the BNP government.

Talking to the members of Shadhinata Chikitsa Parishad, who called on her at her Tejgaon office, she said, "probably for a political stunt, the BNP government set up new medical colleges with only 200-bed hospitals."

Training of a medical student can't be completed without a full-fledged 500-bed hospital, the PM said adding that she has directed the Health Minister to upgrade the attached hospitals of the medical colleges to 500-bed hospitals.

Referring to politicisation policy of the BNP government, Hasina said each and every institution was politicised and those are now on the verge of ruination.
