Mohiuddin new envoy to Nepal

The government yesterday appointed Mohiuddin Ahmed as the Ambassador of Bangladesh to the Kingdom of Nepal, an official announcement said, reports BSS.

A career diplomat Mohiuddin Ahmed did his MA in International Relations in 1959 from Dhaka University and joined the erstwhile Central Service of Pakistan in 1963.

He served as the senior most Additional Foreign Secretary from 1992 to January 1996 till his retirement.

Earlier he served in Bangladesh missions in India, Indonesia and was Deputy High Commissioner of Bangladesh in UK. He also served as ambassador in Senegal with concurrent accreditation to Gambia, Mauritania, Guinea, Ghana and Ivory Coast.

Mohiuddin joined the War of Liberation and was appointed official Bangladesh Representative in Hong Kong in 1971.



FEMA terms Habiganj-2 by-polls fair

Barring few irregularities, the by-election to Habiganj-2 constituency was free, fair and transparent, according to the interim report released by the Fair Election Monitoring Alliance (FEMA) yesterday.

FEMA deployed 28 stationary and 23 roving observers, in the Ajmeeriga and Banlachang thanas of the Habiganj-2 constituency. Out of the 115 polling centres in the constituency FEMA observers' team covered a total of 75 centres, the report said.

The report stated that the poll boycott by the BNP deprived the voters of a wider choice. Overall voter turnout compared to the June 12 parliamentary election decreased by over nine per cent partly due to this boycott, it said.

Irregularities found by the observers included use of mechanical river crafts to ferry voters by the candidates; not applying indelible ink; location of election camp of a party at the door of polling station of Pirichpur Government Primary School in Ajmeeriganj which posed problems to manage the affairs of the polling station.



New commissioner of DMP takes over

Al-Mamun completed his Master's degree in Soil Science from the Dhaka University in 1961. He joined the then police service of Pakistan in 1966. He was trained in International Police Academy at Washington, DC and US Special Forces School at North Carolina, the press release added.
