Women's plea to IOC

LAUSANNE, Oct 17: The world conference on women and sport urged the International Olympic Committee (IOC) on Wednesday to stop the method of gender testing at the Olympic Games, reports Reuter.

The issue of gender testing was the most contentious of 16 recommendations to be presented to the IOC.

Many of the 200 delegates from 96 nations attending the three-day conference objected to tests on women only and complained that present testing procedures were inaccurate.

"The issue is people think that it's a bad idea to treat people one way and not treat men the same way," said Anita Defrantz, chairwoman of the conference and a US IOC member.

Aussie hockey coach renews contract

SYDNEY, Oct 17: Ric Charlesworth, who steered the Australian women's hockey team to the gold medal at the Atlanta Olympics, was given a new four-year contract today, reports AFP.

Hockey Australia announced that Charlesworth had been chosen from six applicants and that he would stay on as national coach until the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

There had been speculation that Charlesworth would quit and take over as coach of the men's team, which finished with a bronze medal at Atlanta.

Charlesworth has been coach of the women's team since April 1993 and was the mastermind behind what was described as one of the greatest teams Australia has sent to an Olympics. The Olympic champions are

also the current World Cup and champions trophy winners, they have not been beaten in 39 matches and they have lost only one of their past 59 games. "Both were attractive jobs," Charlesworth said at a press

conference. "In the end I had to make a judgment on How I felt about where I was and where I wanted to go... I didn't think I had fin-

ished where I was. Charlesworth said he did not believe either coaching position was more important, nor that the men's job would be more challenging because they have yet to win an Olympic title. while the women have won two.

TOKYO, Oct 17: Tommy Morrison, the HIV-infected former world heavyweight boxing champion, will return to the ring in a fight next month in Japan, a newspaper reported Thursday, reports AP.

But the fighter's promoter in the United States denied the report, saying no decision has been reached yet.

Morrison will fight an undetermined opponent near Tokyo on Nov 3, the mass-circulation daily Asahi Shimbun said. quoting unidentified planners for the fight's sponsor.

Morrison, 27, announced his retirement in February after testing positive for human immunodeficiency virus, which causes AIDS. However, the Oklahoma said last month that he would fight again to raise money for his Knockout AIDS foundation.

The planners said the fight will be an undercard for the George-Forman-Crawford Grimsley bout scheduled for Nov 3, the Asahi reported.

Foreman formally issued Morrison an invitation to fight on that undercard and has repeated his desire to meet Morri son in 1997.

Asked about Thursday's newspaper report. Tony Holden. Morrison's promoter in Tulsa. Oklahoma, said no decision or schedule has been reached yet. "There's talk of it, but there is nothing at this point," Holden said in an interview.

weight champion, and Grimsley will compete for the fringe WBU and IBA titles


