STOCKHOLM, Oct 25: Sweden's Tomas Brolin could consider buying out his own contract with English Premiership Leeds United in a bid to free himself from the club, the 26year old international told Swedish television TV 4 on Thursday, reports AFP.

Brolin's remarks came after he spent one month on loan to Swiss side FC Zurich in September. He wanted to remain with the Swiss club until their winter break in December but Leeds United refused and demanded that he return.

Brolin initially ignored their request, but has since met with Leeds officials including new manager George Grahman but his future with the club has not been resolved.

Investigating Judge Hernan Bernasconi has said he will probably cite Maradona for questioning in the case.


