

Warwicks want Lara back

LONDON, Oct 30: Warwickshire revealed Tuesday they want Brian Lara to return to the county as their overseas player for 1998, reports AFP.

Chief executive Dennis Amiss confirmed that "tentative inquiries" have been made through the West Indian batsman's London agents.

A cautious Amiss said: "The 1998 season is a long way off and we certainly wouldn't want Brian back unless he was hungry to play county cricket again."

Lara helped Warwickshire to a record breaking treble in 1994 but pulled out of a contract to return this summer after complaining on 'burn out' following non-stop cricket over the world.

Caddick remains Somerset's

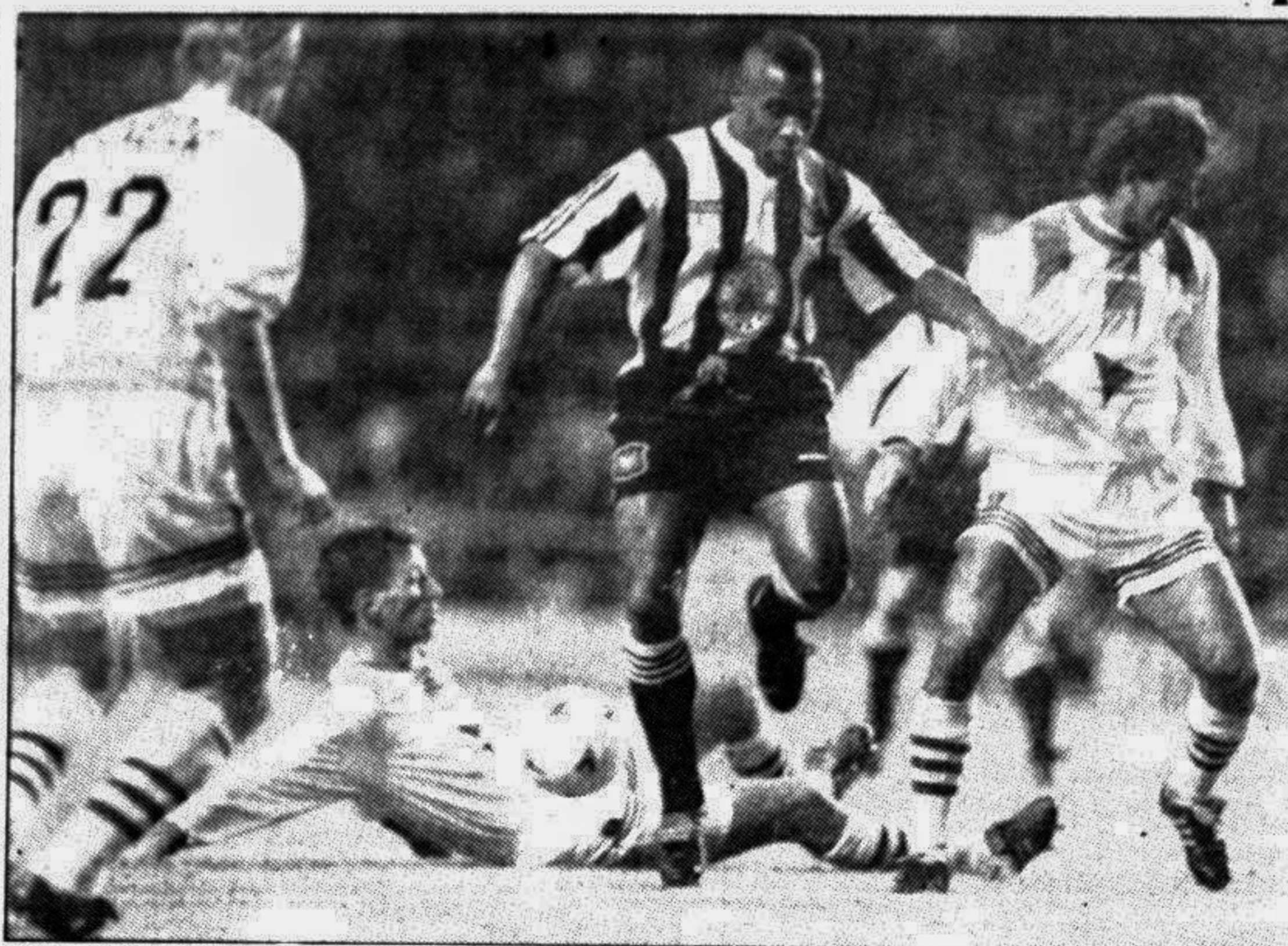

Italians in ignominy

LONDON, Oct 30: An unstoppable volley from David Ginola and a pair of goals from Colombian Faustino Asprilla helped Newcastle to a 4-0 victory over Ferencvaros of Hungary in the UEFA Cup on Tuesday, reports agencies.

Les Ferdinand scored Newcastle's fourth in injury time to give Kevin Keegan's side a 6-3 aggregate win which takes them into the third round.

Ginola, who scored with an outstanding right-foot drive in

Newcastle's 5-0 defeat of Manchester United last weekend, excelled even that strike after Asprilla had seen up the tie with a goal in each half.

The Frenchman, lurking on the edge of the penalty area, trapped a loose ball on his right thigh, teed it up with the inside of his right foot, and blasted a left-foot volley into the top left-hand corner of Jozsef Szeller's net.

The goal confirmed Ginola's recent return to form after a barren spell which saw him dropped or substitute from the Newcastle side for five consecutive league matches prior to the memorable clash with United.

"It was one of my best," he acknowledged afterwards.

Asprilla had dominated Newcastle's forward play until that point.

Lazio and AS Roma bowed out of the competition reducing Italian Serie A representation to just Inter Milan — and they only won on penalties.

Italy has provided seven of the last nine UEFA Cup winners three of those finals were all-Italian affairs, but this season could be a repeat of last when the country failed to provide one semifinalist.

Roma beat Karlsruhe 2-1 in the second leg match but found the 3-0 deficit from the first leg too much of a hurdle, while Lazio lost 5-3 to Tenerife, 5-4 on aggregate.

In Krapfenberg, Austria, Inter went through 5-3 on penalties after Casino Graz won the match 1-0 and put the aggregate score at 1-1. Inter won at home in the first leg 1-0.

Inter relied on former Italian national keeper Gianluca Pagliuca in the shootout, saving Erwin Dampfhofer's spot-kick.

But manager Roy Hodgson's celebrations were marred by the extra time sending off of England midfielder Paul Ince for a second bookable offence, his second dismissal in two weeks.

It was a good night for German clubs in general. Schalke 04 joined Karlsruhe in the next round as they shared six goals at Trabzonspor to edge the Turks 4-3 on aggregate and Hamburg ousted Spartak Moscow 5-2 after a 2-2 draw in Russia.

Borussia Moenchengladbach failed to make it a German clean sweep, however, despite winning 1-0 in Monaco. Michael Klankert scored the only goal, but the hosts hung on having done the hard part by winning 4-2 in the away leg.

In Moscow, Germany's Hamburg SV played to a 2-2 draw with Spartak Moscow, advancing 5-2 on aggregate.

Elsewhere, Metz reached the last 16 for the first time in their history, wrapping up a 3-2 aggregate victory over Sporting

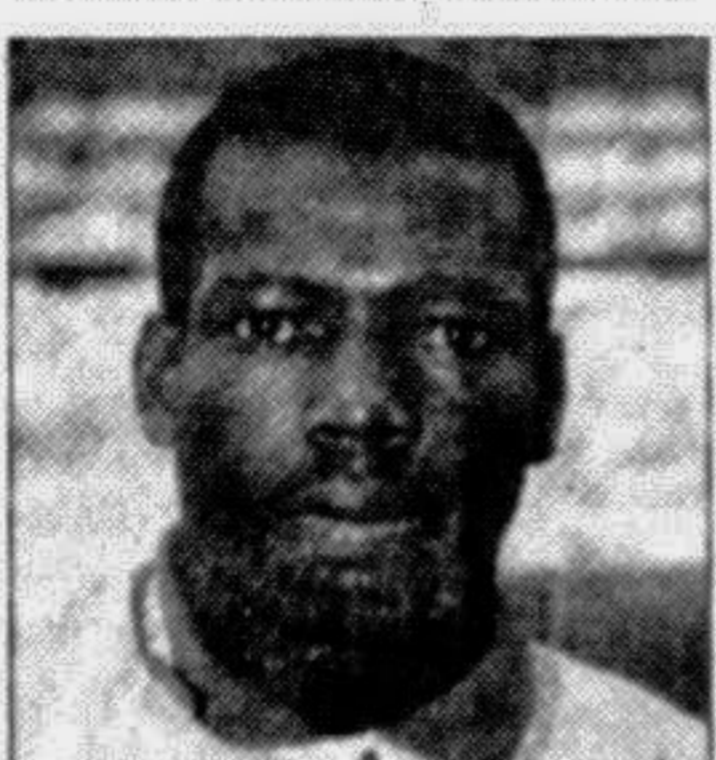
Lisbon after going down 2-1 in the Portuguese capital.

Hamburg court begins hearings

HAMBURG, Germany, Oct 30: Court proceedings began Wednesday in a civil lawsuit filed by Monica Seles against the German Tennis Federation over the 1993 stabbing of the tennis star, reports AP.

Seles, 22, is seeking 24.4 million marks (16.3 million dollars) in damages for lost income following the attack, and is blaming the federation (DTB) for lack of security.

The attack took the top ranked Seles out of the game for 27 months. Although the knife wound in her back healed quickly, Seles has said that psychological problems delayed her return.

Seles was stabbed in the back as she was sitting on the sidelines during a break in a match in Hamburg. Guenter Parche, a deranged fan of Seles' main rival, Steffi Graf, was convicted and received a two-year suspended sentence.

Chief Judge Peter Schade opened the hearing by saying that there was a difference of opinion on responsibility and security.

Seles' lawyers argued that the DTB as the tournament organizer did not provide basic security to keep spectators away from the players, and that no action was taken to stop Parche when he dashed forward to stab the tennis player.
