# Power: ADB offers aid

From Page 1 was also willing to support similar sub-regional cooperation arrangements in the power or other sectors such as trans-

port and telecommunications. Energy Ministry sources said it will be possible to get 100 to 200 megawatt power from across the border through the 132 KV double circuit transmission line. Once the deal is finalised, it will take 8 to 10 months to install the line in Bangladesh side.

World Bank Mission chief in Dhaka Pierre Landell-Mills recently said that interconnector among the countries provided advantages.

He cited the examples of the United States, Canada and Mexico, and the countries in Europe where electricity interconnectors are in existence and each country can use the other's

surplus power. Official sources said the power shortfall has now risen to about 200 megawatt which results in frequent loadshedding across the country. In summer, the shortfall rises to about 400 MW.

There are 23 power plants in the country with installed capacity of 2.908 megawatt, but the maximum capacity actually

stands below 2,200 MW. Although the present generation capacity shown in paper is 2.308 MW, the actual generation is much lower as a number of power plants are quite old and

lack proper maintenance. According to the Energy Ministry, the power demand will go up to 3,000 MW by the year 2000 and to 4,600 MW by the year 2005.

Meanwhile, about a dozen foreign firms have proposed to set up power plants in Bangladesh and the government has started negotiation

with some of them. Earlier, another ADB Mission visited Dhaka from September 21 to 30 to assess the availability of infrastructure projects that may be suitable

for private sector financing. The power projects which are in advanced stage of formulation are: 150-300 MW Haripur/Meghna Ghat combined cycle project at a cost of US dollar 150-300 million, 300 MW combined cycle project to be set up at Baghabari at a cost of US dollar 300 million and 300 MW gas-based plant to be developed together with the newly found gas field in Bhola at a cost of US dollar 350 mil-

Some of them left for their village homes and some joined other sectors as they were not satisfied with the schooling arrangements," said the ILO official. He said, the rest of the 3,500 child workers would be brought under the schooling programme by November this

A UNICEF official said that 48 per cent of the identified 10.547 child workers would attain adolescence (14 years as per Bangladesh law) soon and therefore they might rejoin the BGMEA factories.

According to an ILO-government survey, the country has 6.3 million child workers and most of them were working in agricultural and other 'non formal' sectors.

BGMEA agreed to sign the MOU following growing international concern, specially in the United States, about the use of child labour by the garment manufacturers in Bangladesh. BGMEA along with ILO and




