



Wimbledon champion Richard Krajicek has withdrawn from the Stockholm Open next week with a knee injury and even though it has not ruined his chances of playing in Hanover, it does mean that Andre Agassi has qualified despite losing here in the second

round to Gustafsson. Much to the delight of a noisy French crowd, Boestch's victory was overwhelming. The Frenchman, who had beaten American Jim Courier in the previous round, quickly led 4-0 and Chang, looking hapless, only salvaged one game in 33

We see a lot of exercises in magazines, fitness videos, the local aerobics class and the gym. What we don't tend to see much of is information on exercises that should not be done. In other words we have the "do's" without the "don'ts".

It is unfortunately true that some videos, books on exercise and exercise classes actually show you how to do exercises that could do you more harm than good. There are many exercise that have been done for years that are now thought to be bad for you. These can be split into two groups:


Controversial - which should not generally be used in fitness classes or in the gym. but may be used for sports specific training by highly trained athletes. (Trained athletes may be training specific muscle groups or muscle to withstand greater resistance for their

Contra-indicated - which have been medically proven as unsafe and may cause injury. For example "Extreme Movements" which go beyond a safe range of motion either in distance or direction. Most

movements which involve hy-

perflexion and hyperextension are considered extreme. Such as, 'cobra stretch' (lying in prone position, hands under the shoulders and fully extending the arms, pushing up to bend the back) place the lower back in an extreme extended posi-

tion. While some back hyperextension work is necessary to strength its muscles and stretch the opposing muscle groups. pain can result if the position is extreme. When extending in a prone position go no further than resting on the elbows.
