

Malaysian women MP says

Bangladeshi men are actually handsome

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 6: A Malaysian government backbencher has raised in Parliament the concern of the ethnic-Indian community over sexual affairs between local Indian women and Bangladeshi men working here, reports AFP.

G Leelavathy, a woman MP from the Malaysian-Indian Congress (MIC) — a component party of the ruling National Front coalition government had the lawmakers in stitches late Tuesday when she told the House that Bangladeshi men were 'actually handsome.

Jokes aside. Leelavathy said the Malaysian-Indian community was concerned with the rising number of Indian women having affairs or marrying Bangladeshi men working in

Malaysia. "Indian women must face the reality that they will not be able to lead a decent life if they marry Bangladeshi men and follow their husbands back to their country." Leelavathy was reported as saying in Parliament by The Start newspaper
