The finale of the event takes place on November 23.

Danny denies Lanka's win

SHARJAH, United Arab Emirates, Nov 11: New Zealand fast bowler Danny Morrison grabbed five wickets to snatch a dramatic tie against Sri Lanka in the Champions Trophy here on Monday, reports AFP.

Morrison took three wickets in his last two overs as the world champions, chasing New Zealand's modest 169 for eight, collapsed from 159 for seven to 169 all out.

The gallant Kiwis had Sri Lanka struggling at 98 for six before being pushed back with a 42-run stand by the seventh-wicket pair of skipper Arjuna Ranatunga and Upul Chandana.

After Chandana was caught behind off Nathan Astle for 14, Morrison produced a sensational spell to help New Zealand grab a vital point in the three-nation event also featuring Pakistan.

The 26-match veteran was lucky to terminate Ranatunga's defiant knock of 34 as Zimbabwe umpire Ian Robinson upheld an appeal for a catch at the wicket even though the ball appeared to have nicked the pad.

But there was little more to doubt as Morrison bowled number 10 Sanjeeva de Silva and had last man Muttiah Muralitharan caught in the slips by Stephen Fleming to signal the thrilling tie.

The stunning collapse left Chaminda Vaas stranded on 17, which included a six and two boundaries that brought Sri Lanka closer to surpassing the winning target.

"It was good to be part of such a thrilling result," the 30-year-old Morrison said. "It showed we are not pushovers."

A disappointed Ranatunga said his dismissal was the turning point, but refused to comment on Robinson's decision.

"I thought we would win as long as I was there. But we batted badly chasing such a small score," he said.

New Zealand's innings on a slow wicket was wrecked by upcoming left-arm seamer Sanjeeva de Silva who followed his five wickets in the first two matches with three more.

The experienced Aravinda de Silva chipped in with two wickets towards the end and Roshan Mahanama dazzled in the field with two spectacular catches and a run out.

Kiwi opener Nathan Astle, who failed to score in the first two matches, made amends with a top score of 66, but found little support at the other end.

Mark Greatbatch's 35 was the only other major contribution as eight batsmen failed to reach 20s.

The Sri Lankans collapsed

to 39 for three as Morrison took two early wickets and new-ball partner Simon Doull bowled star batsman Aravinda for one. Morrison had Ramesh Kaluwitharna caught behind and then held a return catch from Marvan Atapattu, who flew in on Monday night to stand in for the injured Kumara Dharmasena.

Mahanama ended the steadily improving partnership with another tumbling catch at mid-on to get rid of Astle. Aravinda de Silva's part-time spin sliced through the lower half to leave Sri Lanka needing less than four runs an over to win.

Lloyd wants Test WC

ALICE SPRINGS, Australia, Nov 11: West Indies team manager Clive Lloyd called Monday day for regulation of the international cricket calendar to produce an official world champions Test team, reports AP.

The World Cup limited-overs tournament is held every four years, but there is no official world champions at Test level although the West Indies had been unbeaten in 29 Test series dating back to 1980 until they lost 2-1 at home Australia last year.

The Australian Cricket Board's marketing slogan for the upcoming five-Test series between Australia and the West Indies is 'The Decider' and the winning team will doubtless proclaim themselves as unofficial world champions.

"Why unofficial?" asked Lloyd. "We're not playing official Tests. Tests are official so something should be set up where you play for the championship of the world."

"You have it in the one-dayers. Why not in the Test matches?"

"At the moment three teams think they're the world champions and I find that so stupid. You're either the champions, or you're not."

Brian gets his bearings

ALICE SPRINGS, Australia, Nov 11 (Reuters): Master batsman Brian Lara is determined to prove on West Indies tour of Australia that his prodigious batting talents and strife with officials no longer go hand in hand.

Lara and Australia left-spinner Shane Warne shape up as the two most prominent players as the two countries do battle this summer for the Frank Worrell Trophy, which Mark Taylor's Australians won 18 months ago to end an unprecedented streak of 29 Test series without defeat for West Indies.

Lara said in an interview on the eve of a tour match against an Australian XI in this outbreak town on Tuesday that he was determined to end a painful period during which his deeds off the field often spoke louder than those on it.

"The team is going through a bad patch and I'm going to be motivated enough and mentally prepared to play a full part in West Indies cricket," Lara told the agency.

Lara confessed that he had made mistakes but he is determined to learn from the experience.

His problems began soon after he hit the world record Test score of 375 in the fifth Test against England in Antigua in April, 1994, breaking a 36-year

record set by the great West Indies all-rounder Sir Garfield Sobers.

Less than two months later the left-handed Trinidadian ended a unique sequence of seven centuries in eight innings by hitting 501 for Warwickshire, the highest first class total ever scored.

"It all started after the Antigua Test," Lara said.

trial figure in the dressing room upheavals that have engulfed West Indies cricket since the series loss to Australia.

Finest for instinct despite losing last year's tour to England, Lara pulled out of a subsequent limited-overs tournament in Australia. Without him, West Indies flopped badly.

"There was wrong-doing on my part," Lara said. "I am a human being, prone to not handling things the way I should have, and I think the West Indies Cricket Board has also accepted some responsibility."

"Hopefully, when challenges come up again I will be able to handle them in a better manner. I am looking forward to the rest of my career being controversy-free," he said.

Lara, 27, maintains that he is still enthusiastic despite the glare of attention and the expectation of fans who want him to perform great feats every time he strides to the wicket.
