

But the wordings "winner of all of the preliminary match(es) played between them will be placed in the higher position" left the organisers. Smith and the players confused.

Smith, a former Test captain, who consulted the London-based Richards over the phone during the lunch break, ruled that net run-rates would be considered since the Kiwis had not won all their

matches. The New Zealand management sought a clarification from the ICC, who then turned to the United Cricket Board of South Africa, the drafters of the

rules, for help. The South Africans informed the ICC that the wordings of the rule were "ambiguous" but said New Zealand should be declared the finalists due to a better league record
