

**WC qualifier Spain stay on course**

TENERIFE, Spain, Nov 14: Midfielders Raul Gonzalez and Luis Enrique Martinez performed strongly in the second half to lead Spain to a comfortable 4-1 win over Slovakia in a World Cup qualifying match on Wednesday, reports Reuter.

The result left Spain third in European Group Six with two wins and a draw. They are two points behind Slovakia and five behind Yugoslavia, who have won all their four games.

A surprisingly open game began with chances at both ends.

Julen Guerrero failed to finish off a well-worked move by the Spaniards with just six minutes on the clock while both Tibor Jankula and Jaroslav Timko squandered chances after slippiness in the Spanish defence.

Spain took the lead through Barcelona striker Juan Pizzi, who celebrated his return to the Tenerife Stadium where he had become Europe's leading scorer by tapping home at the end of a move by Guerrero and Luis Enrique.

But Slovakia went in at the break led thanks to a well-struck free-kick by midfielder Dusan Tittel which left goalkeeper Andoni Zubizarreta floundering.

The visitors, without top striker Peter Dubovsky and veteran midfielder Luor Moravcik through injury, were unable to respond in the second half as the Spanish midfielders pulled out the stops.

**Duel in the desert today**

SHARJAH, United Arab Emirates, Nov 14: World champions Sri Lanka were counting their losses Thursday after Pakistan and New Zealand beat them to the trophy in the Champions' Trophy final here, reports AFP.

Arjuna Ranatunga's men were thrown out of the tournament on Wednesday amidst drama and confusion over the interpretation of one-day rules, but the captain himself was not

looking for excuses. "We were not up to our best here," Ranatunga conceded. "We are capable of doing much better than just one win in four games."

He refused to be drawn on Wednesday's comedy of errors by the organisers and the International Cricket Council (ICC)

who first put Sri Lanka in Friday's final before overruling themselves and giving the Kiwis the nod.

"It's best left to the ICC to sort out such matters. Our job is to play, and we did not do that well," he said.

New Zealand were lifted into the final due to better record against Sri Lanka in the preliminary league where they won the first match by 29 runs and forced a tie in the return game.

The ICC had earlier ruled that the Sri Lankans had qualified on a superior net-run-rate, but changed their minds after the Kiwis sought an explanation on the rules.

Sri Lanka supporters blame the supposed rift between the players and their Australian coach Dav Whatmore for the debacle.

Whatmore, who master-minded Sri Lanka's World Cup triumph in March, resigned last month to replace England coach David Lloyd at Lancashire amid speculation of shabby treatment by the players.

Both Whatmore and the Sri Lankan board have denied the rumours, although the coach's decision to quit the two-year term six months early did little to dispel doubts.

Team manager Duleep Mendis said Sri Lanka would be hiring another Australian to replace Whatmore, but refused to disclose his identity.

As the Sri Lankans packed their bags, Pakistan and New Zealand geared up for their first ever meeting in the final of a major tournament.

Pakistan were logged as overwhelming favourites after two successive four-wicket wins against the Kiwis in the league, but team manager Mushtaq Mohammad is not taking victory for granted.

"New Zealand have shown they do not give in without a fight," he said. "We did not have it easy against them both times and I do not expect a cakewalk in the final."

**Jason waiting for the nod**

HOBART, Australia, Nov 14: Young pace bowler Jason Gillespie hopes an impressive performance for an Australian XI against the West Indies this weekend can seal him a spot on the Australian team for the upcoming Test series, reports AP.

Gillespie, 21, played just four limited-overs matches in 13 weeks in India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka with the Australian team this year but believes this could be the season he makes his breakthrough.

He has a chance to convince the selectors in the four-day match against the tourists, which begins on Friday at Bellerive Oval.

The Australian team to play the West Indies in the first Test, which begins Nov. 22 in Brisbane, will be named on Monday and Gillespie is in line to replace Damien Fleming, who is struggling to recover from a thigh injury.

Gillespie's distinctive long hair earned him the nickname "The Ponytail Express" — and his career took off at a similar pace when he was rushed to the World Cup in February to replace the injured Craig McDermott.

But after the Sri Lanka tour in early September he hopped off his long locks.

**Sidhu skips 3-day tie**

NEW DELHI, Nov 14: Sickly Navtej Singh Sidhu will not captain the President's Board XI in a three-day match against South Africa, an official said Thursday, reports AFP.

Jagmohan Dalmiya, honorary secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India, said Syed Saba Karim take over as captain for Friday's match in Baroda.

Sidhu had earlier claimed he was fit after being asked to undergo a medical test by the board. But he admitted he was unfit to play after taking a second examination.

Hansie Cronje's South Africans, who lost to India in the final of the Titan triangular one-day tournament last week, returned to winning ways Tuesday by defeating Indian state champions Karnataka by 244 runs.

The match in Baroda comes before the first Test in Ahmedabad, beginning on November 20.

The second Test is in Calcutta from November 27 to December 1 and the third Test starts in Kanpur on December 8.

**Stuttgart in last four**

BONN, Nov 14: VFB Stuttgart had to play out most of extra time with 10 men before clinching their place in the semifinals of the German Cup after a penalty shoot-out with Freiburg on Wednesday, reports Reuter.

Stuttgart, who are enjoying a superb season in the league where they are presently second, lost former international defender Thomas Berthold in the 94th minute after his second bookable offence of the night.

But the away side survived to win the quarterfinal 4-2 on penalties. The teams finished 90 minutes and extra time 1-1 after goals from VFB's striker Fredi Bobic and Freiburg's Martin Spann in the 48th and 63rd minutes.

Goalkeeper Joerg Schmadtke missed Bochum's opening penalty of the shoot-out before watching his opposite number Franz Wohlfahrt score a penalty and then save another from Swiss international Alain Sutter to seal the issue.

In the other quarterfinal of the night, Argentine Rodolfo Cardoso, currently on loan from Werder Bremen, struck a late winner to put Hamburg into their first semifinal for eight years in a fortunate 2-1 home victory over Bochum.

Austrian Markus Schopp had given the UEFA Cup campaigners the lead at halftime after a 39th-minute goal before Peter Koezle equalised for Bochum in the 63rd minute.

**Inter innumbrate on Juve**

TURIN, Italy, Nov 14: Inter Milan pulled off a stunning 3-0 victory over European champions Juventus here Wednesday night virtually sealing their place in the Italian Cup semifinals, reports AFP.

Salvatore Fiesi broke down the wing, swept over a fine cross and Zamorano, Inter's lone striker, guided the ball past Juventus goalkeeper Michaelangelo Rampulla after 33 minutes.

Lippi, looking for more punch, swapped a midfielder for a striker at half-time, throwing on Michele Padovano for Zidane, but it was Inter who delivered the knockout blows.

Juventus defenders twice had to stop Aron Winter as the Dutchman surged dangerously into the missed last month's league match through suspension — his absence in midfield partly explaining the defeat, but the result beyond doubt in the 77th minute.

The England midfielder rose to outjump the entire Juventus defence and head home skipper Giuseppe Bergomi's free-kick.

Juventus hit back and Padovano drew a fine save from Pagliuca, but Djorkaeff got his reward for a night's hard work by notching the third after a one-two with substitute Maurizio Ganz.

At the whistle, the only doubt was the date of the second leg.

In a fortnight's time, when the other three quarterfinals are being settled, Juventus will be in Tokyo — facing River Plate for the Intercontinental Cup.

Chilean striker Ivan Zamorano, England's Paul Ince and Frenchman Youni Djorkaeff were the heroes as Roy Hodgson's men erased the memory of a humiliating 2-0 league defeat here last month.

The severity of the hiding leaves Juventus with precious little chance of making amends in the second leg at San Siro, and also showed why Hodgson's side are currently top of the Serie A.

For Inter, who had lost all three of their previous games against Juventus since Hodgson took charge a year ago, it was their biggest win of the season. For Juventus, it was their biggest defeat.

**Seeds bite dust**

PHILADELPHIA, Nov 14: Five seeded players saw action at the WTA Advantage Championships on Wednesday, and all five lost in the final event on the tour before next week's Corel WTA Championships, reports Reuter.

"Everyone's tired," said Olympic champion Lindsay Davenport, the fifth seed, after losing to fellow American Anne Miller 6-4, 7-6 (7-3) in the second round.

"It's the end of the year and all the top players have played a lot of matches. I don't think I played very well and didn't serve well. She played well, but I think it might've been more me than her."

Second seed Conchita Martinez of Spain was upset 6-2, 6-3 by hometown favourite Lisa Raymond. It was the first victory over a top ten player of her career.

"I didn't feel too good today," said Martinez. "I've been sick for about a week and can't seem to recover. I don't know what it is."

"But she played great today and I couldn't get to balls."

Only three seeds are among the 12 players remaining in the tournament, including top seed Steffi Graf of Germany, who will play American Amy Frazier today. Third seed Jana Novotna of the Czech Republic and eighth seed Barbara Paulus of Austria are the others.

The day of frustration for the seeded players began with fourth seed Anke Huber of Germany, the 1994 winner of this event, wasting a commanding lead in a 3-6, 7-6 (7-1), 6-1 loss to American Annarose Werdel-Witmeier.

The sixth seed Iva Majoli of Croatia lost to American Chanda Rubin 5-6, 6-2, 6-1 and seventh seed Mary Joe Fernandez was forced to default to fellow American Kimberly Po because of a sprained right wrist.

The 21-year-old Huber allowed a second-set lapse to revive Werdel-Witmeier, squandering a 5-3 lead to lose in a tiebreak.

Werdel-Witmeier, who had never beaten Huber in three previous meetings, took full advantage.

"I played well until the second set at 5-3," said Huber. "But I just wasn't concentrating enough to finish."

Then she played better when she saw she had some chances.

Werdel-Witmeier, who was sidelined more than four months this year with a wrist injury, agreed.

"I've played very streakily," said the 29-year-old, who lost in the opening round of 11 successive tournaments earlier this year.

"That's been caused by my wrist. For me my forehand is my best shot and I haven't been able to hit it as well as I can. But for me this is the best way to end the year. Now I'll go home, practice and look forward to next year."

She added: "When I broke her to get to 5-4 she kind of threw her racket to the chair. It was good to know she was a bit upset."

**Graf to play in Philadelphia**

PHILADELPHIA, Pennsylvania, Nov 14: World number one Steffi Graf has decided to play in the 450,000 dollar WTA Tour event here ending speculation that she might withdraw because of a knee injury, reports AP.

The 27-year-old German champion, who won the US and French Open titles as well as Wimbledon this year, has not played since withdrawing in the semi-finals at Leipzig last month.

Graf, who earlier this week agreed to play for Germany in next year's Fed Cup, opens here against American Amy Frazier in today's second round.

**An emotional engagement**

NEW YORK, Nov 14: World number one Pete Sampras will be joined by Andre Agassi, Jim Courier and John McEnroe for a fund-raising tennis exhibition at Madison Square Garden December 20 to benefit the Tim and Tom Gullikson Foundation, reports Reuter.

The Foundation honours Tim Gullikson, 44, who coached Sampras for three years before his death from brain cancer last May and assists brain tumour patients and their families.

"It will be very emotional," Sampras said by phone Wednesday from Florida at a Madison Square Garden news conference. "It's not easy. Time kind of heals everything but it won't be the same without Tim in my life."

Organisers hope to raise at least 500,000 dollars.

"I think he will be smiling down at us," US Davis Cup captain Tom Gullikson said of his twin brother.

None of the players are getting paid for the round-robin exhibition.

"These things are easy to say yes to," said McEnroe.

**Woodies get going**

HARTFORD, Connecticut, Nov 14: The top-seeded Australian doubles team of Todd Woodbridge and Mark Woodforde advanced easily in the first round of the 500,000 dollar ATP Tour Doubles Championship on Wednesday, beating Libor Pimek of Belgium and Bryon Talbot of South Africa 6-2, 6-3, reports AP.

The second-seeded team of Byron Black and Grant Connell advanced with a 3-6, 6-2, 6-3 victory over No. 8 seeds David Macpherson and Trevor Kronemann.

**Baggio being discreet**

MILAN, Nov 14: Roberto Baggio, AC Milan's best player in their midweek cup draw with Vicenza, denied on Wednesday that would be trouble if he was dropped for Sunday's big match with Juventus, reports AFP.

The Italian idol, without a regular first team slot this season, knows that his equaliser against Vicenza will not necessarily make him a first choice for coach Oscar Tabarez.

"I'm completely at the coach's disposal," Baggio said. "I'm on form and if he thinks it's right to play me, fine. If not, I'll respect his choice, as I've always done."

"There's never been a row between me and Tabarez because he makes the choices which he thinks are best for the team and sometimes I don't figure in his plans."
