



SAO PAULO, Nov 17: The father of Brazilian soccer legend Pele died on Saturday of heart failure 10 days after undergoing surgery to remove an arterial obstruction in his leg. a spokesman for a local funeral parlour said, reports Reuter.

Joao Ramos Do Nascimento. 79, known as Dondinho, died at his daughter Lucia's home. where he was recovering from the operation, and was buried in the afternoon in the Port of Santos, a spokeswoman for the Beneficencia Portuguesa Funeral Home said

Dondinho, who also played professional soccer, passed on a passion for the sport to his son Pele, whose formal name is Edson Afrantes Do Nascimento

Pele, now retired from the game and Brazil's special sports minister, did not attend his father's burial following a daylong wake, reportedly to avoid drawing a large crowd.

Some 200 others did, however, including Pele's mother Celeste, his wife and his sister after a daylong wake.



### Sino spikers lift World Super title

OSAKA, Japan, Nov 17: Atlanta Olympic silver medalists China defeated Thailand to win the World Super Challenge women's volleyball tournament today, thanks to South Korea's surprising win over Brazil, reports AFP

After watching the Atlanta bronze medalists fall victims to the South Koreans, the Chinese spikers powered past Thailand 15-3, 15-4, 15-2 for their fourth win against one loss to secure the title.

Olympic champions Cuba whipped Japan 15-5, 15-11, 15-7 in the last match for an identical 4-1 win-loss record, but the Chinese were unreachable with a better set ratio. "Even though we've got the

gold medal, we are not satisfied with it, because we were unstable in the tournament," said Chinese coach Lang Ping. " know I have to enhance our players' ability to participate in such a big tournament. We need more training. The Brazilians, who were the

closest to winning the title after beating Cuba on the first day, slumped into making errors in blocking and hitting and lost the crucial match 13-15, 11-15,

"When we lost the first set, we knew we would not win the gold and our players lost concentration. Leila Barros and Vima Dias played badly, affecting others to make easy errors, said Brazilian coach Bernardo Rezende.

South Korean coach Kim Cheol-Yong said: "We didn't expect to beat Brazil in straight sets. Our technique overcame their power and height advan-

The men's tournament will start Tuesday with Olympic champions the Netherlands. silver medalists Italy and bronze medalists Yugoslavia taking on the top three Asian countries - South Korea, China and Japan.

# Spanish soccer

MADRID, Nov 17: Deportivo Coruna wasted a golden opportunity to overtake Barcelona at the top of the Spanish First Division on Saturday in a tedious 0-0 draw at neighbours Compostela, reports Reuter.

Champions Atletico Madrid hung on to beat Espanyol 2-1, but Tenerife and Valencia, both in European action this week, endured contrasting fortunes. Tenerife beat Hercules 3-1

but Valencia could only manage a goalless draw at home to struggling extremadura. Their unhappy fans booed beleaguered coach Luis Aragones at the end of the game and called for the return of Brazilian striker Romario, who left the club last month.

Deportivo's second consecutive goaless draw left John Toshack's side with 27 points from 13 games, one point behind Barcelona, who play Valladolid on Monday. Deportivo missed suspended

striker Michael Madar and injured creative chief Fran Gonzalez in a Galician derby which looked like a practice match. There were less than half a dozen shots on goal in the entire game. Atletico Madrid, in sixth

place, closed the gap on Barcelona to seven points thanks to a strike by international playmaker Jose Luis Caminero and defender Santi Denia's first goal for the club. But Radomir Antic's side had to fight hard to hang on after

Javi Garcia pulled one back for the visitors 10 minutes from the end. Shortly afterwards Atletico were reduced to ten men when forward Kiko Narvaez picked up his second yellow card. Tenerife looked to have vic-

tory tied up thanks to a 55th minute goal by Antonio Robaina, only to see Hercules hit back with just five minutes to go. The Canary Islanders promptly struck again twice before the final whistle.




