A bill was placed in the Jatiya Sangsad yesterday seeking legal provisions for dealing with default loans by declaring the defaulting individuals, companies, firms or statutory bodies bankrupt, reports UNB. Finance Minister Shah AMS

submit its report within one The proposed law has been framed with an aim to take ef fective measures against bank loan defaulters, making uptodate two existing laws - the Insolvency (Dhaka) Act 1909

and the insolvency Act 1920. Provisions for declaring any individual, company firm or any statutory body bankrupt by a court have been proposed in the bill regarded necessary by banking-circle people.

The bill proposes to establish bankruptcy courts by the district courts and the district judge will dispose of the cases under the act. District judge un-

der his judgeship can nominate an additional judge for the trial and disposal of the cases. The bill articulates the

bankrupt activities which include transfer of all and almost all property to a third person to foil or delay claims, leaving the country or normal workplace, or one's loan amount exceeds Tk 5 lakh and he or she fails to pay the amount within 90 days of issuance of a formal claim. If any loanee becomes

bankrupt, one or more eligible creditor or the said debtor, under the act, can file petition and the court can issue an order declaring the debtor bankrupt. The bankruptcy court can set

aside a petition filed by a credi-

tor, and if a petition is set aside on the point that it was unfounded or futile, the court can order the creditor to pay not Any debtor, creditor, reciptent and person aggrieved by the

verdict of the district or additional district judge can submit appeal to the High Court. The Supreme Court will form a bench which only dispose of such appeals. The Finance Minister also

BUET stalemate: 25 teachers resign from admn posts

Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) have resigned from their administrative posts saying "it has become impossible for them to discharge their respective academic and administrative duties under the present situation".

They include four deans, ten departmental heads, seven provosts of the residential halls and four directors of different offices, according to a press release issued by the BUET Teachers Association (BUETTA) yesterday.

In the resignation letter they also urged the Vice Chancellor Prof Shahjahan to resign from his post immediately for resolving the ongoing crisis in the university.

Meanwhile, the stalemate in BUET continued for the 22nd day yesterday due to the indefinite work abstention called by the Teachers' Association on October 28.
