SA pace puzzles Indians



India. Nov 20: Vilan Donald led a South African

revelry on a spite-

ful wicket to restrict India to 215 for eight on the opening day of the first cricket Test here on Wednesday, reports AFP.

Donald showed that fast bowlers were as dangerous in conditions tailor-made for spin by picking up three for 33 from 23 superbly controlled overs. Wickets fell regularly as the South Africans neutralised

India's advantage of winning the toss and batting first on a wicket that may become unplayable by the third day. India were reduced to 165 for

six before the tail wagged to add a further 50 runs for the loss of two more wickets.

Sunil Joshil (16) and Javagal Srinath (14) added 28 for the seventh wicket, while vice-captain Anil Kumble (13 not out) and Venkatesh Prasad (seven not out) put on 19 for the unbroken ninth.

Jonty Rhodes struck two major blows with his brilliant fielding, flinging himself at mid-wicket to catch skipper Sachin Tendulkar (42) before running out Mohammad Azharuddin for 35. The run-out ruined

Azharuddin's day after he became the world's only cricketer to play a home and away game against all the eight other Test playing nations. Umpires George Sharp of

England and SK Bansal of India hogged the limelight at the start of play with some stranghe decisions that left both teams puzzled. Sharp turned down a first-

ball appeal by Donald for a legbefore decision against Sanjay Manjrekar. Television replays showed the batsman was lucky to survive. Bansal rejected another

confident lbw appeal against Manjreakar by Fanie de Villiers, before rewarding the same bowler with the scalp of the other opener Navan

Mongia, however, looked unfortunate to be declared leg before to a ball that appeared to be

missing the leg stump.

Both sharp and Bansal stood in last week's Champions' Trophy final in Sharjah, where they handed out five controver-

ing is unlike any other motorspot due to the unpredictability of the water they



In motor racing, drivers are working with smooth tarmac surfaces with corners that never change," commented Jon Jones who is lead driver for the John Player Gold Leaf FI Racing Team and three times World Champion, "Whereas in Formula One powerboat, we are dealing with a variable surface influenced by the weather. other boats and numerous other elements, which means no corner or straight is ever the same So no one can be taught how to be a champion, it really is a matter of getting as many championship races under your belt and getting to know how to compensate for these vari-

Current world champion. Italian Guido Cappellini, totally agrees.

Experience alone, however, is not enough. Above all there has to be the inherent talent and desire to be a winner - pure dedication to the sport. The top drivers are constantly 'fine tuning their own performances, as well as the engines and boats, to gain the advantage over their rivals. the drivers have to be

physically fit due to the demands on the body as it is

tossed around inside the small enclosed cockpit and the need to steer the boat against several Gforces. In common with other sports people, Formula One powerboat drivers know that physical well-being sharpens the mental state in preparation for the demands of high speed racing and creates the quick reflexes necessary to react to unforeseen situation.

As with any motorsport, a huge amount of responsibility is placed upon the engines and boats. Talent can only go part way to compensate for mechanical failure and uncompetitive equipment. Formula One powerboat racing is, currently, in a similar position to its motorsport counterpart with one team having technical dominance over rivals.

But, for Guido Cappellini this is not something that has happened overnight.

The Cappellini team is run on very professional lines. His race truck is a maze of technology with computers that monitor every aspect of the engine's performance.

With the stress that 10.000 rpm can place on these 2 litre Mercury outboard engines this is of paramount importance. Cappellini also builds his own boats enabling him to apply what he learns from his racing experience to the design.

The Italian's dominance does not act as a deterrent to the other teams. Rival Jon Jones. The technical superiority Guido has achieved has been a spur to all other teams and it has to be good for the sport as overall standards are going to be raised because of it.

With the help of John


Player Gold Leaf, we are now investing time and money in engine and boat development in preparation for the 1997 season. We realise that it will take time, but if my co-driver Paul Blackburn and I are going to properly show our talent we must be competitive in the mechanical department." The talk around the Formula One circuit is who can

challenge the experience of Jones, Cappellini and Werner for future world titles. Young Italian, Massimo Roggiero has made a huge impact in just two seasons and seems destined for a few Grand Prix wins; Humaid Bhakit from Abu Dhabi has also made an impressive start to his Formula One career.

This season, Bhakit has had the temerity to beat Cappellini to the coveted pole position, but when it comes to the race he has not had the experience to sustain a challenge

Paul Blackburn in his first season in Formula One is determined to make it to the top. "Having had several seasons in Formula 3, I didn't find the transition particularly difficult. I am luckily to have the support of a great team and sponsor in John Player Gold Leaf to help me achieve my goal.

Many of the Formula One powerboat drivers have Formula One motor racing drivers as there persona heroes. They undoubtedly see the same dedication, lack of nerve and lightning reflexes The financial rewards are nothing like as great, but this still does not reduce their desire to win and reach the top of their chosen sport.



A racist's rapport!

AMSTERDAM, Nov 20: UEFA president Lennart Johansson said on Tuesday his racist comments were a bad joke but the controversy surrounding them will not deter him from pursuing the FIFA

presidency, reports Reuter. Johansson arrived at the UEFA congress meetings following a storm of criticism over racist remarks he made in a Swedish newspaper article where he referred to Africans as blackies.

Having kept a low profile since his comments first appeared last Thursday, Johansson stepped from his car and marched confidently towards waiting cameramen and reporters, appearing eager to explain his remarks. "In the Swedish papers I was

quoted quite properly," said Johansson. "I was using one word which was suppose to be funny and it wasn't funny at all. "I have no excuse.

"But to turn this into racism is too much for me.

"But if you do something that is foolish and you don't watch your tongue you have to take the result."

Johansson explained the circumstances that led to the remarks, admitting that the interview was taped leaving him no room for denial.
