

The Board has formed a five-

member development committee headed by Raisuddin Ahmed, a senior vice-president. to prepare a suitable proposal for BCCB's future course of action. The committee which also included Syed Ashraful Huq. Tanvir Haider, Altaf Hossain and Bobby, was asked to submit a report within a week.

Besides, the executive committee has also approved the draft proposal of the Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolitan (CCDM), who had earlier decided to go on with the two phase league format, the super league and the relegation league ensuing the 12-team first

The selection committee. however, is likely to announce preliminary national team just after the 17th Damal Smriti cricket tournament. The season's curtain-raiser will conclude on November 29.


