IOC, WB join

torces WASHINGTON, Nov 22: In an unusual merger of muscle with money, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the World Bank said on Thursday they would work together to promote sustainable human development worldwide, re-

ports Reuter. An agreement signed by International Olympic Committee (IOC) president Juan Antonio Samaranch and World Bank president James Wolensohn called for creation of a joint working group to develop a programme of cooperation.

Possibilities included distribution of soccer balls in poor neighbourhoods, development of playing fields at World Bank construction projects and nutrition advice to athletes.

"Personally it means a great deal to me." said Wolfensohn. who competed at the 1956 Olympics as an Australian fencer. "I know the ideals of the Olympic movement and I see how congruous they are with the work of the World Bank.

Added Samaranch: "We are convinced that our cooperation in field projects in favour of dereloping countries will be very positive.

The World Bank is an intergovernmental agency with 180 member countries that lends tens of billions of dollars each year to developing nations. The IOC is a non-profit, non-gov ernment organization for 197 member national, Olympic committees that conduct athletic programmes in their coun-



"I told you right from the beginning that I will win. I was under pressure to win this one and in the fourth game." beaming Khan said.

"I wanted to take an early lead and played my shots. I worked and I won it. I played better through out. I am delighted to win my eighth title. he said

Before this title decider the two players had clashed in four tour finals this year and Eyles has Hong Kong Open final win as his solitary achievement against Jansher

Jansher had clinched the finals of British Open. Qatar Open and Al-Jazira Open against Eyles

Jansher has now five British Open titles to add to his eighth World Open crowns and has now entered into the nineties as far as his major tournament wins are concerned.

Jansher made his debut in World Open in Cairo in 1985 where he lost to Kelvin Smith of Australia in the second round. He won his first title in Birmingham, England in 1987 where as a 17-year-old he defeated Chris Dittmar of Australia in the final.

Even since then Jansher has won in Kuala Lumpur (1989). Toulouse (1990). Johannesburg (1992), Karachi (1993), Barcelona (1994). Nicosia (1995) and now again in Karachi (1996).

Eyles has now enrolled him self in the list of players who have finished runner-up to the champion. Dittmar was left to rue his

luck on four occasions. Peter Marshall, Jahangir Khan and Del Harris have once lost in the final against Jansher.

Australian Rodney Martin (1991) and New Zealand's Ross Norman (1986) are the only lucky players to have won the world title in between 14 titles that Jahangir and Jansher clinched from 1981

The 1997 World Open will be held in the Malaysian city of Kuala Lumpur.


