BRISBANE. Australia. Nov 24: A sensational middle-order col lapse by the West

lucties saw Australia take a strong grip on Sunday, third day of the first cricket Test at the Gabba, re-

ports AP Medium paceman Paul Reiffel and leg-spinner Shane Warne routed the visitors' middle order in just under an hour as the tourists slumped to 277 runs all out - 202 runs behind the home side's first innings total of 479 Skipper Mark Taylor de-

clined to enforce the follow-on - opting to bat for the second time - as his team extended its overall lead to 210 at stumps. Australia was eight without

loss after six overs with Matthew Elliott and Mark Taylor on two and four respectively.

After an impressive century from Carl Hooper and a backto-the-wall innings from Shivnarine Chanderpaul had given the side a glimpse of hope of a batting revival, the islanders collapsed after tea.

#### Hooper's edgy experience BRISBANE, Nov 24: West In-




