

Three fire-trucks rushed to Calcutta's downtown Grand Hotel and firemen doused the flames in 40 minutes, hotel staff said. There was no major damage to the rest of the build-

More than 80,000 turned up to watch the start at the 100,000-seater Eden Gardens despite a general strike in the eastern metropolis in protest against the eviction of street traders from crowded street lanes.

A witness of the hotel fire said firemen had to break open a window to enter the suite, located in the northern wing of the colonial hotel, built around a courtyard.

"It would have been a major disaster had the cricketers been inside the suite," a fire brigade official said.
