

Heat treatments can also be dangerous for individuals with heart disease, high blood pressure or diabetes or in women who are recently pregnant. The effect is a rapid increase in resting heart rate, and lowering of blood pressure which is immediately (and perhaps dangerously) raised when leaving the heat.

Instant cooling such as jumping into a cold pool or shower can exacerbate the problem. Heat treatments should not be used within an hour of eating or while under the influence of alcohol or drugs such as anti-coagulants, stimulants, hypnotics, narcotics of tranquilis-

The blood tends to pool in your extremities after a vigorous workout, and steams, saunas, hot tubs and even hot showers tend to dilate your blood vessels, it is really not the best thing to do as it will be more difficult for the blood to reach the heart and brain. However, if you've done a through aerobic cool-down, and you wait a reasonable amount of time to return to almost normal, you might go into one of these "fun" things. But if you feel any sign of weakness or dizziness, get out immediately.

"Sauna suits", "tummy wraps", and other products designed to encourage quick weight loss through sweat are particularly dangerous — the body can reach dangerous (or even fatal) core temperatures in very short periods of time. Weight lost by these methods will be regained as soon as water is ingested again, and so the

risk outweights any "benefit". Swirl pools: As with sauna and steam baths, swirl pools can be relaxing form of post-exercise enjoyment. However, they have little or no effect on weight control or physical fitness. If water temperatures are




