

JERUSALEM, Dec 6: PLO negotiators said today Palesti nian President Yasser Arafat Israeli Prime Minister Benj amin Netanyahu and Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak might all meet on Saturday to try to clinch a deal on Israel's handover of Hebron to the PLO.

"It is very possible that Arafat and Netanyahu will meet in Cairo on Saturday. There is work on arranging such a meeting hosted by President Mubarak," one PLO official, who requested anonymity, told Israeli officials said no





### Death of tigers BELA serves legal notice

Lawyer's Association (BELA) Thursday served a legal notice upon the secretary of the ministry of fisheries and livestock. director general of the department of livestock services, curator and veterinary surgeon of the Dhaka Zoo for the tragic unnatural death of four tigers. one horse, two deer and one jungle cat. The notice served by Dr Mo-

General of BELA pointed out that after the first incident of death of a tiger it was logically expected that the authorities and persons responsible would take necessary measures to prevent further deaths. "But unfortunately, there

was gross negligence on the authorities part to fulfil legal and constitutional obligations, said the legal notice.

The notice added, subsequent investigations and autopsy reports suggested that the deaths were caused by poisoning and accused the officials and employees of the National Zoo for their unlawful, criminal and malicious activities.

The notice demanded the government to take appropriate actions against the violators responsible for the deaths of the animals so that such incidents do not happen again in future.

It further submitted that if the authorities responsible did not give any satisfactory answer by Dec 29 next, BELA would take legal actions under the constitution, law and equity against the above mentioned persons.

kind of intervention is undesirable, he said. Had the government narrowed down the gap between demand the supply by releasing more shares, then the market would have been cooled down automatically. he observed.

According to him, members of the stock exchanges were not solely responsible for the situation. Rather, the government, the Securities and Exchange Commission some outside traders and even a section of the media were responsible for the crash, he said.

Dr Devaprio Bhattacharia of BIDS has said that the situation is "neither a crash nor a correction." "It is part of the cycle in stock markets.

Referring to the bull run in the country's two stock markets he said "It was well known to everybody that the way it went up would not sustain.

One might witness resumption of a new cycle when it will go down to the level of August-September, he said. The market may stabilise after declining to the bench mark of the position that prevailed two months back, he added.

Supporting the recent initiatives taken by the government, Dr Devaprio said that it was done with a good intention to "cool down the overheated capital markets without much social cost

Another leading economists. who preferred anonymity teamed the current market situation a "crash

"The government is still hopeful that the market will be bullish again because of its lack of understanding of the reality."

"The government did not make this market go high, it can not also stop the crash," he said. "If the government wants to stop the crash, it will have to finance through the ICB. And

this finance will turn out to be a huge subsidy," he observed. He noted that the government did not give its attention

to the share market in time. It came to protect the securities market when it was about to crash. "The actions taken by the government shook small investors' confidence by some proportions. But it is true that even if the government had not taken those actions, the crash would have taken place any-

He further observed that the foreign currency reserve and the balance of payment would be affected by the net outflow of portfolio capital

"But, in general, the economy will not be affected by this crash," he pointed out," this crash had rather been an individual tragedy," he said Analysing the stock market

phenomenon further he said that when demand for liquidity rose extremely, the banks were facing problems because those were not getting enough refund of the loans taken by people "Now the situation is returning to normalcy. So the working capital will return and economic activities will gear up

again. A positive impact of the "crash" would be felt in the country's business sector which became "stagnant" during the share market boom, he observed. "But some real resources were transferred out of the country and those can not be rectified." he observed adding "the government should take immediate measures to prevent

further capital flight. A negative impact of the crash would be felt in the governments' attempt to privatise some public sector enterprises through releasing their shares in the secondary market because less number of investors would come up to buy those shares, the economist observed.
