

jor's wafer-thin majority was effectively wiped out when right-winger Sir John Gorst launched his protest over a hospital closure in his London constituency. Friday's bombshell ended a

eral election by next May, faces another rough ride next week with a two-day parliamentary debate that will offer a perfect opportunity for right-wing lawmakers to fuel their mutiny over Europe. Terry Dicks, one of the so-

called "Eurosceptics" who wants Major to rule out British entry into a single European currency and abandon his "wait and see" policy, launched a savage attack on the prime minister. Threatening to quit the ruling party, Dicks said: "I don't
