# Principal held for 'torture'

## 21 students rescued from Ctg madrassah

CHITTAGONG, Dec 8: Police today rescued 21 students of a madrassah who were fettered as punishment and arrested its principal and a teacher for perpetrating torture on the youngsters, reports UNB.

Kotwali police conducted an operation at Tasbidul Quran Mohissunnah Madrassah at rail station colony and found the students in fetters, two days ahead of Human Rights Day.

Hundreds of people from different parts of the port city thronged the Kotwali police station to see the ill-fated students and the cruel principal.

The principal. Maulana Saleh Ahmed, and teacher Mohammad Waliullah were kept in police custody while the rescued students were taken

into safe custody. Local people said they were shocked to hear cries and shouts of the students everyday and at one stage they informed the police.

The son of the principal. Abdullah Al Mamun, a student of class seven of the madrassah, was among the 21 students who were put in fetters with an iron weighting about 5 kg.

I did not complete my lessons and for this I have been punished this way for last one month." said 11-year-old Ataul Haq, who hails from Fotika of Hathajari thana.

His father, Mufti Ahmedul Haq, got him admitted to the madrassah only one and half months back.
