VIENNA, Dec 8: Germany's Axel Schulz outlasted Cuba's Jose Ribalta to win a heavyweight bout Saturday against a bigger, but slower and older opponent, reports AP.


The three judges unanimously awarded the match to Schulz, 28, after a free-wheeling final 10th round in which he knocked Ribalta to the canvas. Ribalta came back and lasted the last 17 seconds to the bell to no avail.

The 34-year-old Cuban now living in the United States started to lose it in the second round, when the former sergeant in the Communist East German army landed a powerful right on Ribalta's chin, rocking him to the ropes.

It was Schulz's right that won the fight, landing again and again in the subsequent rounds. Though more than 11 kilograms (more than 24 pounds) lighter at 97.6 kilograms (214.7 pounds), the German was clearly in better condition than his veteran oppo-

It was Ribalta's first loss in his last six fights, and an important psychological victory for Schulz. He came in off consecutive losses to George Foreman, Francois Botha and Michael Moorer.
