

# Asia's reactions to WTO accord

HONG KONG, Dec 14: Asian countries hailed a World Trade Organisation (WTO) accord to help the poor, but reactions were mixed to another portion of the pact that would do away with information technology

tariffs, reports Reuter. While government officials and experts in Tokyo, Taiwan, and Manila welcomed the effort to loosen restrictions on information technology trade, a Chinese trade expert said China and other nations would resist

such moves. Ministers from the WTO on Friday sealed a sweeping pact to free commerce in information technology, help the poor and set the agenda of world trade talks for the rest of the century.

The accord followed a week of intense and often acrimonious negotiations among the 128-member world trade watchdog.

We welcome the fact that the WTO conference achieved much more than expected, despite difficulties. Chief Cabinet Secretary Seiroku Kajiyama told a news conference on Friday.

This is vital for the maintenance and development of the free, multilateral trade system," said Kajiyama, the top

with the ministry of foreign trade and economic coopera-

"It is unlikely at this juncture that developing countries can remove all traded restrictions on information technology products - whether these are tariff or non-tariff barriers' Li told Reuters by telephone.

But a Philippines computer expert welcomed a loosening of information technology barriers, saying it would boost emerging countries' economies.

The leser the barrier in bringing in information, technology products to emerging countries like the Philippines. the better," said Fe Ferriols, General Manager of Philippine information technology consulting group systems Integration Co.

Australia said the WTO agreement represented a "winwin" outcome for its exporters.

A statement released from Singapore by Trade Minister Tim Fischer said the WTO agreed on a range of steps delivering "gains pure and simple" for Australian exporters and industry. India's government came under opposition fire for accepting an agreement sealed at the conference.

# Political uncertainty in India blamed for slow econ growth

NEW DELHI, Dec 14: The political uncertainty in India and insensitiveness in macro-management by decision-makers are widely blamed for a sustained slowdown in economic growth that has been plaguing the country in the past few

months, reports Xinhua. Ever since the government led by Prime Minister HD Deve Gowda assumed office in June. there has been general concern about whether the new government, consisting of 'rainbow' small parties with different

policy orientations, would and could further carry out the country's economic reforms initiated by the former gov-

> Although the reform process has survived in the past few months, the government's every step forward was challenged by difficulties and setbacks, which triggered fears for an all-round economic recession and deepened the concern over the future of the coalition minority government.

According to the central statistics organisation, India's export growth in April-Septem-ber 1996 declined sharply to 9.91 per cent from the year-ago level of 26.37 per cent, and the import growth, even more dramatically, to 5.2 per cent from 32.79 per cent.

In the April-August period, 24 major industries accounting for 50.37 per cent of the industrial index registered a growth rate of 5.6 per cent, compared with 12.6 per cent one year ago.

The infrastructure sector grew by only 3.5 per cent as against 11.7 per cent in the corresponding period last year. with the growth of electricity segment falling from 11.7 per cent to 2.4 per cent.



### Pakistan to fire 5000 bank employees

KARACHI, Dec 14: The Pakistan government plans to fire more than 5.000 employees of the country's largest state-run bank who were recruited during the era of deposed Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto officials said Friday, reports AFP.

Officials said the appointment had been made to the Na tional Bank of Pakistan (NBP). "bypassing" the bank's rules and regulations.

The affected employees include office workers, clerks, cashiers and other lowranking

staff, they said. The three year old Bhutto government dismissed by President Farooq Ahmed Leghart on November 5 amidst accusations of rampant corruption and misrule, appointed 5,028 people in NBP from April 1995 up to its ouster, sources said.

Finance Ministry officials hinting at job cuts, recently claimed the nationalised banks were over staffed by 40 per cent.

The NBP with more than 1.500 branches around the country has 20,000 employees officials said adding that in some branches the strength of staff exceeded the number of seats available

Formal termination letters were expected to be issued this weekend but the bank's union has said the sackings are "un-

#### Deep sea port near Sonadia under consideration

COX'S BAZAR, Dec 14: Shipping Minister ASM Rob has said that establishment of a deep sea port near Sonadia Island is under active consideration of the government and feasibility to this effect is being studied, reports BSS.

The Minister who visited Sonadia Island, some 18 kms from Cox's Bazar town, was addressing a gathering at Moheskhali yesterday.

The Shipping Minister said overseas investors have been encouraged for establishment of the sea port on the island.

## WB sees one-third of \$22b loans unsatisfactory

WASHINGTON, Dec 14: The World Bank said on Friday that an independent audit of some 22 billion dollars of its loans to developing countries found nearly one-third fell short of goals and were deemed unsatisfactory, reports Reuter.

The review, conducted by an independent evaluation department at the Bank, found that 68 per cent of loans had satisfactory outcomes in 1995. That compared to 66 per cent in the previous year.

The Bank said it was a modest improvement but not a break from the long-term trend. To be judged satisfactory, a lending project must meet goals that are in keeping with the Bank's assistance strategy and must be consistent with the Bank's overall goal of poverty reduction. The loans must also

#### IMF approves resumption of lending to Russia

WASHINGTON, Dec 14: The International Monetary Fund said on Friday it approved the resumption of lending to Russia, giving the go-ahead for the release of roughly 336 US dollar million to the struggling country, reports Reuter.

"Executive Directors approved the disbursement of the monthly (loan) tranche," an IMF spokesman said in a statement.

The IMF had withheld paying two monthly loan tranches to Russia to October and November, largely because of dissatisfaction with the low level of government revenues. Since then, the country has worked to get back into the IM-F's good graces through a concerted drive to get Russian companies to pay the taxes they

# WB happy over three agro-based projects

The World Bank has expressed satisfaction over three on-going agro-based projects while it has stopped financing one for unsatisfactory progress. according to Continuous Reporting of Project Status (CROPS) of the WB published last month.

The three projects are: Agricultural Support Services. Third Fisheries Project and Forest Resources Management.

The Bank also started funding two projects recently on agricultural research management and coastal embankment rehabilitation.

Dwelling on the Third Fish eries Project' which costs about Taka 767.34 million, the WB said the overall fish production under the floodplain fisheries component has maintained an increasing trend. The project implementation progress is satisfactory. The project which was taken up in 1990 is likely to be completed this year.

The WB was also satisfied with the progress on Agricultural Support Services Project taken up in 1991. This project is supposed to be completed by June next year. The bank has released more than Taka 548.10 million out of the total project cost of Taka 1.485.96 million.

"Progress is satisfactory in the technology transfer and training, homestead production and seed industry development components," the CROPS noted

But the WB was unhappy with the progress of Taka 2320.50 million 'National Minor Irrigation Project' taken up in 1991. The WB cancelled credit disbursement noting that "the government needs to expedite action on the transfer of ownership of Deep Tubewells (DTWs)

The Bank cancelled the credit balance after releasing about Taka 101.22 million and suggested direct involvement of private operators.

The WB said some fundamental issues need to be addressed to achieve the objectives of the Taka 2216.76 million "Forest Resources Management Project" taken up in

The bank released 44 per cent of the total credit for the project which is scheduled to be completed by June 2000.

Meanwhile, the WB started funding the Coastal Embank ment Rehabilitation and Agricultural Research Management Project that would cost Taka 4.123.22 million.

## Prospect of single Euro currency brightens

DUBLIN, Dec 14: European Union leaders have brought the vision of a single Euro currency in the pockets of 370 million citizens a step closer to reality after clinching a hard-won pact on strict budgetary discipline. reports Reuter



# UN ban costs Iraq \$120b

ABU DHABI, Dec 14: Iraq has lost 120 billion dollars because of the ban on its oil exports under economic sanctions imposed by the United Nations more than six year ago. Iraq's trade minister said today, reports AFP.

"Our losses because of the oil embargo have totalled at least 120 billion dollars. This has caused severe damage not only to Iraq but to the countries which were dealing with it," Mohammed Mahdi Saleh told the United Arab Emirates economic weekly Emirates Today.

Iraq produced more than three million barrels per day (BPD) of oil under and OPECassigned quota before its 1990 invasion of neighbouring Kuwait. Oil prices averaged between

six years, during which Iraq has been barred from exporting crude and other products under a crippling economic embargo. Iraq re-opened its oil taps on Tuesday for the first time since the imposition of the sanctions
