The woman identified as Hasni Begum, 30, is a member of an organised gang of child traffickers said police. Details about Hasni who hails from Comilla, could not be known immediately.


The father of the boy, identified as Amir Hossain, is a rickshaw puller. Police handed over the boy to his parents yester-
