Over 6 lakh teenage girls in slums deprived of edn

Speakers at a discussion in the city Thursday said thousands of disadvantaged teenage girls are being misguided due to lack of healthy atmosphere for their growth, reports UNB.

They pointed out that the adolescent girls, particularly those living in slums, often fall victim to sex abuse and the existing environment forces them to go for prostitution.

Dhaka Adolescent Working NGOs (DAWN), a forum of 20 NGOs working for the slum people, organised the discussion to find ways to protect the poor girls from sex abuse and ensure their proper growth.

According to DAWN, Dhaka's slums have more than 604,918 teenaged girls who do not get minimum facility for healthy growth and are deprived for minimum education and health care.

The speakers said it is easy to misguide the slum girls when biological changes occur among them as the slums are highly insecure.

The teenaged slum girls take mental preparation that they have to be sex workers or maid

servants as they have no other ways to think for better future.

In most cases, extreme poverty forced the teenaged girls to choose prostitution and occasional sex to earn money.

The participants said the government, donor agencies and NGOs have no programme for the adolescent girls in the slums. Both the government and NGOs are taking programme for the children and women development, but, none look at the teenage girls.

The speakers called upon all to take up comprehensive programmes and come forward to help the disadvantaged girls for their healthy growth.
