Jessore jail revolt

ately brought to the notice of the Jail Superintendent, the sources said.

The Superintendent sent an SOS to the district police when he failed to control the situation. The Superintendent was holding the charge following suspension of the DIG of the Jessore Central Jail in August. Just a day after he had taken over.

The SP along with some police officials arrived at about 9 am and informed the Deputy Commissioner of the situation in the Central Jail. The DC who was reportedly attending a Silver Jubilee celebration programme reached there at around 11:30 am, the sources said.

The SP could not get into action as he was waiting for order from the DC. Even after reaching the central jail, the DC failed to gain control over the situation and by that time, the situation had gone out of control, the sources said.

Sources said that the differences between the two orders and withdrawal of the privilege of remission for certain categories of prisoners in the second order was already brought to the notice of the Home Minister and the file was also processed for the higher authorities.

Expecting adverse reaction from the prisoners for withdrawal of the earlier declared privilege, the authorities maintained hush-hush about announcing the names and number of the prisoners to be released on the occasion of Victory Day.

As the prisoners also maintain their own record and count their prison term, a large number of them were expecting release as was the case under the 1991 caretaker government. Compared to the expectation of 13 prisoners, declared on the occasion of the Victory Day this year, is very less, the sources said.

A litany of charges against unscrupulous prison officials and wardens were brought by the relations of the prisoners. They alleged that a 'fee' is charged for each visit and ac-

cording to its duration, additional 'levies' are charged for supplying food parcels, simple amenities of life like a bar of soap or toothpaste, even cigarettes.

Besides, money makes the way for liquor and drugs for the 'privileged gangsters.' Ordinary souls pinning for mundane privileges like a morsel of meat or fish and even leafy vegetables, must grease the palms of their captors. Nothing, even an extra blanket or a shirt, water for bathing, a bed in hospital, diet for patients, usually richer than normal food, is available without money.

Odhikar, a coalition of human rights organisations, who conducted a probe into the Jessore jail conditions also alleged that a plate of beef for Tk 10 is provided by a Subedar to over a thousand prisoners per day. Three times a week beef is served irrespective of choice but the privileged buy the meat and only the bones are left for the underdogs.

Money also decides the degree of fettering. Taka one thousand could reduce the weight of the fetters from five kg to two kg. Taka 700 lowers the weight to three kg, and those who cannot pay must stumble with chains and rods weighing five kg that often leaves them permanently crippled because of infections.

There are systems of reducing letters on medical ground if a doctor certifies. And there are allegations of exemptions on payment, the Odhikar alleged further. Even amenities for sleeping quarters go to the highest bidders, it said.

The jail authorities denied the allegations but they refused to allow newsmen or anyone else to visit the prisons.

best for a peaceful solution of the stalemate, but stubbornness of the prisoners led to such an unwanted situation, Sheikh Hasina told the all-party meeting.

Political leaders and lawyers who attended the meeting, however, informed the Prime Minister that this unwanted situation could be averted if the Home Minister or the Home Secretary had talked to the prisoners as they demanded.

They also suggested the Prime Minister to take decision regarding the two opposite decisions taken by caretaker President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed in 1991 and Chief Adviser Justice Habibur Rahaman in 1996.

Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed gave general amnesty to the prisoners commuting their jail term which was cancelled by Justice Habibur Rahman in 1996.

The local leaders in the meeting also raised the issue of mismanagement and corruption on the part of jail authorities and suggested reform of the age-old jail code, solution of accommodation problem in jail and expediting the trial of cases.

Responding, the Prime Minister said the government had taken steps for speedy disposal of cases from grassroots level.

The management council of DSE is now predominantly manned by brokers. "But we want it to be expanded and diversified. There are now nine representatives from brokers and three nominated by the government — one of them from the finance ministry and one each from the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI) and the Institute of Chartered Accountants.

They (the exchange management) have agreed to carry out the necessary reforms the next three months, the source added. He said that the SEC is planning to ensure more transparency in the exchanges. As part of this, a surveillance team, comprising an official from SEC and a representative from the DSE have already begun a surveillance and monitoring in the bourse.

Computerisation of trading and a central depository system are also in the offing for the exchanges, the source said.

Patients suffer as token strike at DMCH on

Patients in the indoor and outdoor sections of the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) were facing serious problems as the Class Four employees of the hospital continued their two-hour token strike for the fourth day yesterday.

The strike is affecting normal work in the hospital severely as the employees keep off duties in the peak hours from 10 am everyday, said a senior official of the DMCH.

The employees are protesting a reported assault on a cleaner by the Director of the DMCH on Wednesday last. They are demanding removal of the Director by Dec 26. If he is not removed the Class Four employees will declare the Director persona non grata on December 28, according to sources.

The token strike is seriously hampering work in the outdoor section as the patients are not getting outdoor tickets from the counters, said an official of the hospital.
