#### India test-fires Trishul missile

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: India has successfully test-fired a short-range anti-aircraft missile it has developed, the Press Trust of India said today, reports Reuter.

The news agency said Trishul missiles were fired on Saturday from a mobile launcher at the Chandipur test range in the eastern state of Orissa.

The Trishul, named for the trident carried by the Hindu god Shiva, operates on solid fuel. It has a range of up to nine km and can carry a 15-kg (33-lb) warhead.

Earlier this month, India bowed to Western pressure and rolled back its nuclear programme. It decided to shelve deployment of the Agni, an intermediate-range ballistic missile capable of carrying nuclear wearheads, after successfully completing research on the pro-

The Agni is designed to hit targets up to 2,500 km away.



#### 5 hurt in Lhasa bomb blast

BEIJING, Dec 29: A powerful predawn explosion in the Tibetan capital, Lhasa, has injured five people, a monitoring group reported Saturday, reports AP.

The explosion, which occurred after midnight on Dec 25, was at least the fourth confirmed bombing in Tibet in 1996 and the first time Chinese authorities have admitted to a specific instance of sabotage there, the London-based Tibet Information Network said.

A broadcast on the state-run Tibet Radio, monitored by the BBC, accused supporters of the exiled Tibetan Buddhist spiritual leader Dalai Lama of staging the blast as a "serious counter-revolutionary political incident and an appalling act of terrorism," the group said

#### Benazir's close aide released

KARACHI, Dec 29: A close aide to deposed Pakistani prime minister Benazir Bhutto, Abdullah Shah, was released from detention late today after a court accepted his bail plea in a corruption case, witnesses said, reports AFP.

The Sindh High Court ordered that Shah, a former chief minister of Bhutto's home Sindh province, on a bond of 200,000 rupees (5,000 dollars).
