

300 killed as Bodos blow up train

GUWAHATI, Dec 30: At least 300 people were killed today when a powerful bomb ripped through several carriages of a packed train in India's northeastern state of Assam, police said.

A senior police official told Reuters here that separatist Bodo militants had used a remote-controlled device packed with explosives to blow up the Delhi-bound train.

The bomb exploded at around 1930 hrs just after the train left Kokrajhar Railway Station where it halted for a minute only, sources said. The distance of the site of the incident was about 216 km from Guwahati by rail.

A high railway official told PTI here that the station master of Kokrajhar Railway Station heard a loud explosion just as the train left the station and immediately informed the district Deputy Commissioner and Superintendent of Police about it.

The force of the blast was so intense that it also derailed the engine and two other coaches of the train.

northeast regions and the rest of the country, injuring seven people.

A police officer told Reuters today that ethnic Bodo rebels blasted the bridge over a small river at Rakhaldui, between the towns of Bijni and Bongaigaon on national highway 31 in the tea and oil-rich state of Assam.

Witnesses reported a huge line of about 5,000 trucks on the highway linking the adjoining state of West Bengal to Assam. They said the trucks were carrying essential supplies including fuel and food.

Repairs had started on the 12-metre long bridge, police said, adding that a massive operation had been launched to arrest the guerrillas.

Bodo tribals have killed hundred of people in Assam including Indian security troops.

Activists representing Bodo tribesmen living north of the Brahmaputra River want a homeland within India in the state of Assam, but an extremist fringe, the Bodoland army, has been fighting for a separate nation since 1989.

Union Parishad polls in April

The government has decided to hold Union Parishad elections in the country in April next year.

The decision was taken at a cabinet meeting last night with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair, cabinet sources said.

The cabinet also decided that from now on, formal reception to state guests would take place at the airport and five ministers including the foreign minister would be present, the sources added.

The meeting in principle agreed that a national stock exchange would be set up. But be-

fore taking a final decision on the issue, the government would seek suggestions from different sections of the people, specially businessmen, industrialists and experts.

Some logjammed shares to be freed

Circuit breaker to be relaxed to 10 pc

the past fortnight following last month's upheaval in the market, the sources said.

It is also likely to free some shares which remained logjammed at high prices at the height of the bull run in October.

The decision was taken yesterday at a meeting of the four-member circuit breaker committee, according to a highly placed source.

The decision to widen the circuit breaker on price fluctuation was taken to help raise the volume of trading in the bourses which had been witnessing a shattering business in

the past fortnight following last month's upheaval in the market, the sources said.

Meanwhile, two members of the SEC, Dr Shahabub Alam and Alamgir Kabir, are likely to be removed from their posts in a couple of days as part of the work to reorganise the statutory body, authoritative sources said. None of the two members were available for comment.

Earlier, they were summoned by the finance ministry and were asked to resign, the sources said. However, they reportedly decided to wait for

Team to monitor Ganges flow leaves today

A team of four engineers leaves Dhaka today for Farakka for monitoring the discharge of the Ganges water as per provisions of the recently concluded 30-year agreement between Bangladesh and India.

The recording and observation of the Ganges flow begins tomorrow.

Bangladesh is due to receive a quantum of 67,516 cusecs during the first 10-day cycle of the dry season, from January 1 to 10. Water flow for the five-month dry season beginning from the first day of the new year has been charted out in 15 cycles in the accord signed on December 12.

The joint monitoring of the discharge of water on the Indian side will be conducted at three

Kader Siddiky refutes allegations

Four BCL, one JCD leaders arrested

TANGAIL, Dec 30: Awami League MP Kader Siddiky, Bir Uttam, today reiterated his demand for dismissal of Home Minister Major (rttd) Rafiqul Islam, Bir Uttam, for his alleged failure in maintaining law and order.

Meanwhile, police arrested four leaders of Awami League backed Bangla Chhatra League (BCL) and one leader of BNP-backed Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) from the town today.

The arrests followed the arrest Sunday of Azad Siddiky, leader of a BCL faction and younger brother of Kader

Siddiky.

A series of clashes between rival groups of Bangladesh Chhatra League earlier this month left one BCL activist dead and 13 persons wounded and created a tense situation in the town.

Azad Siddiky was arrested on Sunday in a 15-hour raid in his family home in the town and was given one month's detention. He was accused in 19 different cases, police said earlier.

Kader Siddiky, addressing a press conference at the Tangail Press Club alleged that harass.

BNP leaders, MPs of greater Dhaka meet today

An emergency meeting of the BNP leaders and its MPs of greater Dhaka city and greater Dhaka district will be held at the party central office at 4 pm today, reports UNB.

The meeting will be attended by the party MPs from Dhaka city, Narayanganj town, and Dhaka, Narayanganj, Gazipur, Munsingdi, Munshiganj and Manikganj districts.

Presidents and general secretaries of the district committees and party candidates who contested in the last general elections from the districts will also join the meeting, said a press release yesterday.

Party Secretary General Abdur Mannan Bhuiyan will address the meeting.

BOGRA, Dec 30: A half-day hartal, called by the district unit of BNP demanding removal of ADC (Revenue), was observed here today, reports UNB.

The district BNP accused ADC (Revenue) Mushtaque Ahmed of tearing a picture of late president Ziaur Rahman at Bijoy Mela in the town on December 16.

Shops were closed while bus and train communications in the district were disrupted for six hours from 6 in the morning.

Pickets damaged several rickshaws and motorised vehicles as these tried to ply in the town defying the hartal call.

District BNP and its front organisations brought out procession in the town and held a protest rally at the Satmatha crossing in the morning.

50 killed as cold snap grips Europe

BUCHAREST (Romania), Dec 30: The coldest weather Europe has seen in a decade has killed more than 50 people and left hundreds of thousands without power, water or heat, reports AP.

The massive snows have also blocked supply routes and left areas without telephone connections. Swiss and other European weather officials are calling the frigid temperatures the coldest in a decade.

In Bulgaria, 13 people have died, including four at an unheated psychiatric hospital. One of the four jumped from a window shouting, 'I'm dying of

cold,' according to the BTA news agency.

The cash-strapped Bulgarian government earlier had warned that heavy snowfall could bring the country to a halt, saying it lacked the funds to clear roads and railways.

Rescue teams with bulldozers struggled to clear roads, particularly in northeastern Bulgaria where the snow blocked the delivery of food, fuel and medicine.

Gas consumption was up sharply, slowing supply deliveries. Airports in the Black Sea cities of Burgas and Varna were closed Sunday.
