Rahman said the matter of the formation of palli parishad was under the active consideration of the government to build a strong and truly representative local government structure at grassroot level.


Reception accorded to FF Rotarians

Speakers at a function in the city Tuesday emphasised the need for writing the real history of the Liberation War dispelling




