## Kuwait returnees' team meets Speaker

A 19-member delegation of Bangladesh Kuwait-Iraq Repatriated Association met Speaker Humayun Rashid Chowdhury in the city Saturday and submitted a memorandum appealing early distribution of compensation money sanctioned by a UN commission.

The delegation, led by association chairman Md Misbah Uddin, sought the Speaker's help in resolving problems faced by over 62,000 foreign wage earners who were forced to return home from Kuwait and Iraq during the Gulf war, says a press release.

They apprised the Speaker about their demand for making public the government's decision about Tk 113 crore, allocated earlier for rehabilitation of the returnees.

## Eligibility for Submission of Application for the Admission Test:

- Candidates must have passed SSC examination of any Education Board of Bangladesh or its equivalent and obtained at least 50% marks on the average or equivalent grades.
- Candidates must have passed HSC examination of any Education Board of Bangladesh or its equivalent and obtained at least 65% marks on the average in the subjects of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry and minimum of 50% marks in each of these three subjects separately or equivalent grades in these subjects.
- A merit list on the basis of the marks of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry only of the HSC examination or the equivalent grades in these subjects will be prepared out of which only the first three thousand and five hundred candidates will be allowed to take part in the Admission Test. All candidates in the three thousand five hundredth position having equal marks, will also be allowed to take part in the Admission Test.

## Subjects of Admission Test:

The admission test will be taken only on the subjects of Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Functional English on the basis of the Syllabuses of HSC examinations conducted by the different Boards of Bangladesh in 1996.

## (A) Eligibility for Submission of Application for Admission Test in Architecture Dept.

- Candidates must have passed SSC examination of any Education Board of Bangladesh securing minimum 50% marks excluding marks of additional subjects or must have passed equivalent examination securing equivalent grade.
- Candidates must have passed HSC examination of any Education Board of Bangladesh or its equivalent securing at least 50% marks in Mathematics and minimum 55% marks excluding marks of additional subjects.
- A merit list on the basis of the marks obtained in HSC examinations (excluding marks of additional subjects) or its equivalent will be prepared out of which only the first three thousand candidates will be allowed to take part in the Admission Test. The admission test will be taken on the subjects of Mathematics, General Knowledge and Science, Design and Free-hand Drawing and Written Discussion in English.
